

# For Up, Commonwealth Campuses University Announces Changes

The following appointments have been announced by the University for the coming year. The appointments and positions are effective both at University Park and at Commonwealth campuses.

Maurice Inman, associate professor of mechanical engineering, has been named associate professor of metallurgy in the department of materials science.

He will serve also as electron microscopist in the Mineral Constitution Laboratories and will be in charge of the electron microscope section.

**Kenneth C. Madden**  
Kenneth C. Madden, who received his doctor of education degree at the University in 1950 in educational administration under O. H. Aurand and Hugh M. Davison, has been named State Superintendent of Public Instruction for the State of Delaware.

He had been superintendent, Special School District, Seaford, Del.

**Virginia Zilliox**  
Virginia Zilliox, teaching fellow at the University of Pittsburgh since 1964, has been named instructor in English at the Beaver Campus of the University.

Miss Zilliox received her bachelor of arts degree in English from Wellesley College, and her master of arts degree in English from Mills College, Oakland, Calif.

She served as a fellow in humanities at Mills College from 1959 to 1960, and as an English teacher at Woburn Senior High School from 1957 to 1958.

**Herbert Findlen**, research horticulturist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, has been appointed adjunct assistant professor with the College of Agriculture at the University.

Serving with the department of agricultural engineering for a nine month period as of September, Findlen will work with Nureddin M. Mohsenin on research related to physical properties of fruits and vegetables.

Before coming to the University Findlen carried out research on quality evaluation of potatoes and sweet potatoes for the Plant Industry Station of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Beltsville, Md. Earlier he was horticultural field station leader for the U.S. Department of Agriculture at East Grand Forks, Minn.

He is the author or co-author of 35 technical publications on potatoes. He received the doctor of philosophy degree from Cornell University in 1950 and the bachelor of science degree from the University of Maine in 1942.

Associated with the U.S. Department of Agriculture since 1949, Findlen has worked primarily on quality maintenance and evaluation in harvesting, handling, storage, and shipping of potatoes and sweet potatoes.

**Peirce Lewis**  
Peirce F. Lewis, professor of geography at the University, has been appointed to a three-year term as a member of the Steering Committee of the High School Geography Project, sponsored by the National Science Foundation and the Association of American Geographers.

Lewis was also appointed to the Committee for the Use of Topographic Maps in Human Geography, sponsored by the Commission on College Geography of the Association of American Geographers.

**Carl W. Kreitzberg**  
Carl W. Kreitzberg, of the Air Force Cambridge Research Laboratories near Boston, Mass., has been named assistant professor of meteorology at the University.

Besides teaching, he will supervise and conduct research into the structure and dynamics of mesoscale circulations, which range in size from 10 miles to 5,000 miles. His specialty is the integration of information obtained from surface reports, radars, balloon-borne instruments, aircraft, and satellites to determine the mechanisms responsible for winds, clouds and precipitation.

While at the Air Force Laboratories, Kreitzberg worked in the satellite meteorology branch on projects

dealing with cloud forecasting. He was also coordinator for Project Stormy Forest, a pilot study of mesoscale structures within storms utilizing special networks of surface, rawinsonde, aircraft and radar observations.

He is continuing his study of these data, particularly with respect to cloud and precipitation bands, on features of the wind and thermal fields. He has also published a study of the implications of the thermal field on forecasting for supersonic transports ascent through the transonic acceleration region.

Kreitzberg is also affiliated with an Air Force study of short term precipitation forecasting in South Vietnam using satellite and radar data in conjunction with data from mesoscale network of rawinsonde sites. The rawinsonde network, measuring temperature, humidity, moisture and winds aloft from instruments on a rising balloon, has been established by the Army to provide artillery aiming information.

Reared in Missoula, Mont., Kreitzberg attended the University of Washington in Seattle for both undergraduate and graduate work in the department of atmospheric sciences. At the same time he became a commercial pilot and flight instructor and had the pleasure of flying sportsmen in and out of mountain lakes (via float planes) in western Washington and British Columbia.

**Robert Lima**  
Robert Lima, assistant professor of Spanish and humanities at the University, has been named to the nominating committee of the Modern Language Association's Modern Spanish-American Literature section.

The committee is responsible for organizing a proposed slate of new officers to place before the section prior to the annual meeting of the Association in Chicago, Ill., Dec. 27-29.

Author of numerous poems and articles, Dr. Lima joined the faculty at the University after two years with the University's Beaver Campus where he was in charge of the foreign language and humanities program.

His works include "The Theatre of Garcia Lorca," as well as translations of "Borges the Labyrinth Maker," and "Valle-Inclan: Autobiography Aesthetics, Aphorisms."

**Frank V. Touchstone**  
Frank V. Touchstone has joined the University faculty as associate professor of education in the department of educational services.

He comes from Centenary College, Shreveport, La., where he served as associate professor of psychology and director of the counseling and testing center.

Besides teaching, Touchstone will be responsible for the recruitment, selection, and advising of graduate students in the Rehabilitation Counselor Education Program.

He holds two degrees in psychology from Purdue University. They are master of science and doctor of philosophy.

From 1956 to 1960, Touchstone served as a counseling psychologist at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Marion, Ind., and for the next three years was counseling and clinical psychologist at the VA Hospital in Shreveport, La.

Touchstone is a member of the American Psychological Association, American Personnel and Guidance Association. He has served as associate editor and editor of the Rehabilitation Counseling Bulletin, a publication of the American Rehabilitation Counselor's Association. He served on the Research Awards Committee of this Association from 1958 to 1966 and was chairman in 1963-64.

# Law School Exam Dates

The Law School Admission Test, required of candidates for admission to most American Law Schools, will be given at more than 250 centers throughout the nation on November 11, 1967, February 10, 1968, April 6, 1968 and August 3, 1968. The test, which is administered by the Educational Testing Service, was taken last year by over 47,000 candidates whose scores were sent to over 160 law schools.

ETS advises candidates to make separate application to each law school of their choice, and to ascertain from each whether it requires the Law School Admission Test. Since many law schools select their freshmen classes in the spring preceding entrance, candidates for admission to next year's classes are advised to take either the November or the February test.

The morning session of the Law School Admission Test measures the ability to use language and to think logically. The afternoon session includes measures of writing ability and general background. A Bulletin of Information including a sample questions and registration information, and a registration form should be obtained seven weeks in advance of a testing date from Law School Admission Test, Box 944, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, N.J. 08540. Registration forms and fees must reach ETS at least three weeks before the desired test administration date.

# State Statistics Director Named Capitol Campus Prof

Kenneth W. Masters, former director of the Bureau of Statistics in the Pennsylvania Department of Internal Affairs, has been named associate professor of social science at the University's Capitol Campus.

His appointment was announced Wednesday by Dr. Richard H. Heindel, dean of the Capitol Campus faculty.

Masters served as director of the Bureau of Statistics from 1955 to 1961. He has just returned from Nigeria where he served for four years as a technical assistance adviser for the United Nations.

A graduate of Brighton, N.Y., High School, Masters received his bachelor of science degree from the University of Pennsylvania, where he also received his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics.

While working on his doctorate, Masters served as a lecturer in social research at Bryn Mawr College and as an instructor in statistics and sociology at the University of Pennsylvania.

Following his service with the Commonwealth, he became a technical assistance adviser for the United Nations in the Philippines, where he served during World War II.
