DiBernardo said the Student Peace Forum, an out-growth of the Faculty Peace Forum, performs functions similar to the Coalition. Its office, 103 E. Beaver Ave, is now open to all interested students and faculty members. Its present activities, include debate promotions, newsletter writing and draft counseling.


