Incomplete registration figures for the University for the Spring Term show an enrollment of 23,125 students at the University Park Campus and 12,529 at other locations for a total of 35,654.

Stanford predicted that final figures will bring the University Park total to 24,700 and the total for other locations to 14,300 for a grand total of 39,000 students for the Spring Term.
