

Turnout key to track club hopes

More than fifty students, faculty members, university employees and housewives are expected at six p.m. tonight in Beaver Stadium for the initial spring practice of Penn State's Women's Track and Field Club.

The club, which is open to all women here, had only nine members last year and lost all three scheduled meets due to large numbers of forfeitures. However, Coach John Lucas is optimistic for the club's second year due to the large number of women who signed up, and feels his squad will be "far more representative" this time around.

The women will run four times this spring, including two Beaver Stadium appearances which coincide with men's events. As part of varsity coach Harry Groves' plan to integrate men's and

It also will meet Cortland State in New York and will travel to College Park to meet Maryland later in the season.

The meets will feature eight track and two field events if the turnout is as large as

will also be included. The field events include the shot put and discus.

Key returnees include Nancy Marx, who ran the 100-yard dash in 12 seconds last year for the club's best mark in that event, and Felicia Barge, a 110-yard low hurdler. Her time of 17 seconds was low for the team.

Autumn Colton returns to run the quarter-mile and will try to better her time of 61 seconds.

In the field events, Lucas has returnees in Priscilla Schoonover, who is a shot-putter, and Diane Underwood, a high-jumper. Schoonover put the eight-lb. shot 41 feet last year, and hurled the discus 99 feet.

Underwood topped the club in high-jumping, leaping 4-feet, nine inches.




