

Stickmen outmuscle Drexel 9-6

Any attackman or mid-fielder that weaves his way through Penn State's head-hunting defense still has to put the ball by Rich Caravella before the referee signals a goal.
Drexel found that out the hard way Saturday. The Dragons, a team expected to challenge Franklin and Marshall for the Penn-Del. crown, appeared on the AstroTurf with their 16 goals-per-game average ready to slay the Lions, whose title chances are less than those of a dark horse according to

coach Dick Pencek. There wasn't anything mythical about the yellow clad Dragons who were outthrust, out hustled and outscored by Penn State. While his teammates made it difficult for Drexel to operate on offense, Caravella guarded the Lion nets with the same vigilance that Cerberus, a three-headed dog with a serpent's tail in Greek and Roman mythology, watched over the entrance to Hades. The Lion sophomore thwarted several one-on-one thrusts by Drexel and was credited with 23 saves. "He was phenomenal," Pencek said in an understatement. "He's going to be an All-America," Pencek predicted. "He showed why today."
When told what Pencek said about him, Caravella grinned and said that any post season honors would be the result of a team effort. Despite his brilliant stickwork, Caravella wasn't satisfied with his play. "They still got six off me," he said. The goalie said he works for a shutout... "It's the ultimate," he said, conceding a whitewash rarely occurs in collegiate lacrosse. A high scoring game isn't always the fault of the goalie, but Caravella said he would

take the responsibility for a net full of goals. "It still has to get by me. I'm the last man to stop it," he said.
While Caravella was nearly magic in the goal, both teams had trouble scooping up ground balls on the slick AstroTurf. The game was a physical one and included a first quarter fight between Lion defenseman Jim Clouser and Dragon attack Robert Ambler. Both Clouser and Ambler were hit with three minute fighting penalties and were ejected from the game. Without Ambler to set up scoring plays, Drexel went to quick-footed Ira Peezick. The 5-6 attacker controlled stretches of the game and combined two goals with three assists against the school that tried to recruit him.
"He was phenomenal, I wish we had him here," Pencek said.
The Lions broke a first quarter tie with three goals and held a 5-3 advantage at halftime. Drexel edged to within one with the third quarter's lone score, a goal by Ken Benjes on a pass from Peezick.
"We only hustled in one quarter," Pencek said after the game. The quarter happened to be the pivotal fourth period and Penn State was able to keep the Dragons at bay while adding four points.

Jim Connelly scored two tries for Penn State; Dr. John Reidell, John Saxe and Terry O'Toole scored one each.

Reidell also picked up a penalty kick, and Dave Lobbs drop-kicked a goal from about 40 yards out to round out the Lion scoring.
The local club's B side also won, 16-0. Gavin Reed had two tries, while Cal Marcus and Steve Ekerovich each tallied one.
Yesterday, the Lion B's defeated Dickinson 12-0 while the C side lost to Dickinson's B's 17-0. Penn State had lent several players to fill out the visitor's side, as is rugby custom. — BH

Knicks advance; Hawks, Bulls tie series

NEW YORK (AP) — Walt Frazier scored six points during a decisive 13-1 spurge in the fourth quarter yesterday as the New York Knicks won a berth in the National Basketball Association's Eastern Conference playoff finals with a 109-99 victory over Baltimore.

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — Pete Maravich triggered an Atlanta rally late in the fourth quarter powering the Hawks to a 97-94 triumph over the Boston Celtics yesterday, squaring the NBA Eastern Conference semifinal series at two games apiece.
Maravich threw in 13 of his game high 37 points in the final period. The teams will meet in Boston for game No. 5 Wednesday.

CHICAGO (AP) — Bob Love pumped in 38 points yesterday to lead the Chicago Bulls to a 98-94 victory over the Los Angeles Lakers in a nationally televised NBA playoff game.
The Victory for the Bulls knotted the best-of-seven first-round series at two games each. Game No. 5 will be played in Los Angeles tomorrow night.
Love put the Bulls ahead to stay 87-86 with about six minutes remaining.

They now will meet the winner of the Boston-Atlanta series for the Eastern title.

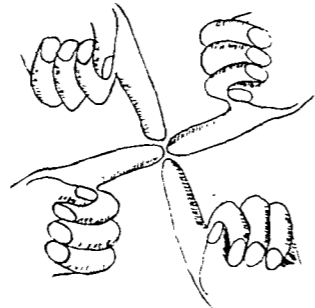
