## **Consumer-protection** bill passed

WASHINGTON (AP) -The Senate passed a major consumer-protection bill yesterday requiring sellers to state specifically what their warranties mean.

The bill, which now goes to the House, also expands the power of the Federal Trade Commission to deal with all unfair practices affecting consumers.

Passage was by voice vote. The bill allows the seller of any product worth more than \$5 to decide whether he will issue a warranty. If he issues the warranty, he must disclose whether it is a full guarantee or describe it in

easily understood terms. The minimum standard for disclaiming any implied any such warranty requires the seller promise to replace

or repair any malfunction or defect within a reasonable misleading practice of using time without charge. And if the product requires an unreasonable number of consumer rights which would repairs during the warranty period, the consumer has the the disclaimer of implied right to demand and receive a replacement.

## Watergate hearings to resume

WASHINGTON (AP) - Seeking to wrap up its probe quickly, the Senate senators have lost their taste for the long Watergate committee yesterday voted and detailed examination of the type unanimously to resume public hearings they conducted into the Watergate Sept. 24 and attempt to complete them break-in and White House cover-up. by Nov. 1.

Chairman Sam J. Ervin Jr., D-N.C., said the panel would "expedite the proceedings by hearing witnesses with highly relevant testimony" only. He said the committee was "not responding at all to pressure" to keep the hearings from public view.


