

## Eagles pesty but still losers

# Harris leaves bench, beats Jets

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Reserve quarterback Terry Hanratty and reborn fullback Franco Harris came off the bench yesterday to rescue the Pittsburgh Steelers in their 26-14 win over the New York Jets.

Hanratty replaced starter Terry Bradshaw early in the last quarter and passed 16 yards to Ron Shanklin for the winning touchdown.

However it was Harris who brought the most thunderous roars from Steeler fans, who had waited six games for last season's rookie sensation from Penn State to shake off a knee bruise.

Harris, who had only 53 yards rushing previously, entered the game late in the first quarter and finished with 102 yards on 26 carries. He also plunged two yards in the final seconds for his first

touchdown of the season. "I never did actually lose my confidence," said the typically subdued Harris. "You take the good with the bad," he added. "Things were going pretty bad, but I kept saying to myself that if I got the chance I was going to do it. Today I did it."

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. (AP) — Speedy wide receiver John Gilliam took a reverse 44 yards for a touchdown and hauled in a scoring pass yesterday as the Minnesota Vikings overcame the pesty Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 and

remained unbeaten in the National Football League. With 4:05 left, Charles Young swept 14 yards on an endaround to move the Eagles within a touchdown. Philadelphia quarterback Roman Gabriel shredded the Viking secondary for 23 completions in 32 attempts and directed the Eagles' to two other touchdown drives.

Those were capped by Lee Boggess from two yards out in the third and cut the Viking lead to 21-14.

The B team tied Pittsburgh Law 12-12, while the C team lost to Susquehanna A 22-4. The A unit now has a 5-3 record.

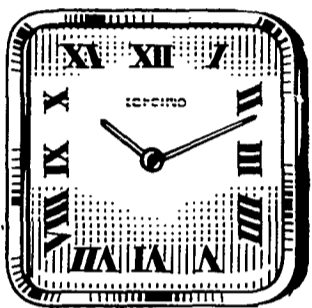

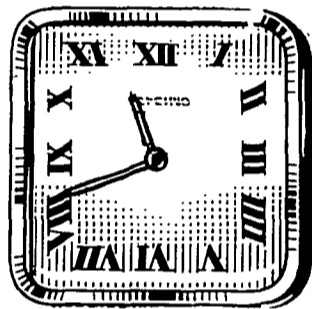

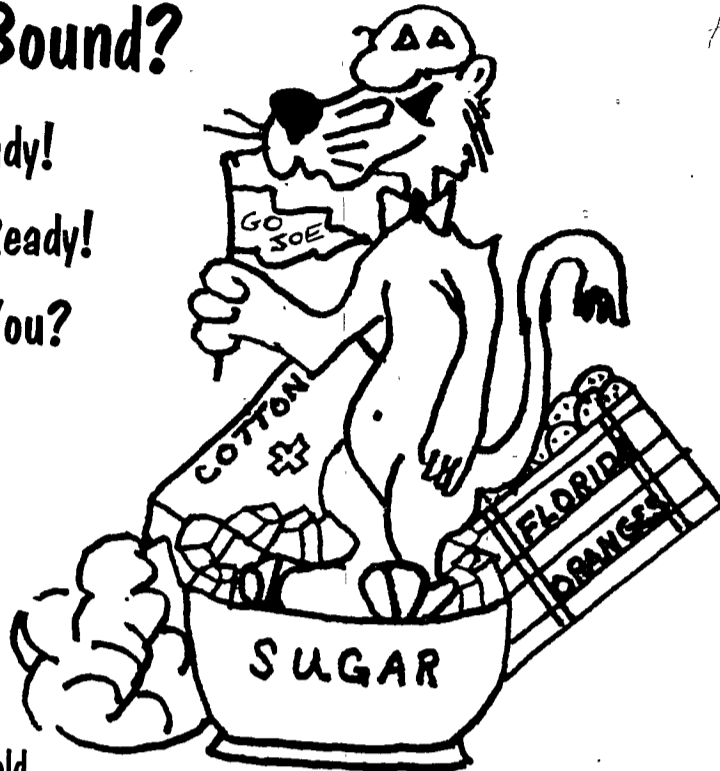
