JUDGE OF ELECTION and INSPECTOR

Appearing on the ballot will be candidates in each precinct for these offices. We regret that space does not permit listing all the names in Voters Guide, since these officials, together with appointed clerks, are responsible for the orderly conduct of elections. They have charge of the district register, issue and receive ballots, and

count votes after the polls close. Compensation, not to exceed \$39, includes a flat fee plus a figure based on number of ballots cast.

JUDGE OF ELECTION: Assigns specific duties to each election officer and clerk.

INSPECTOR: Majority and minority inspectors are elected, representing different parties. The Judge of Election and Minority Inspector together transport the ballot box from polling place to Court House, for which each receives a fee of \$3.50.
