

Lions — Owls soccer matchup

Walter Bahr in 4th year at Temple (6-1-4 season; 18-11-14 lifetime)
Herb Schmidt in his 6th year at Penn State (6-1-1 season; 36-20-7 lifetime)

TRADITIONS
The Lions won 5-3 at Temple last year. Temple's last visit to Jeffrey Field was a memorable one: a 9-0 Lion rout. Bahr: "Our kids that played there still haven't forgotten that one."

SEASON AT GLANCE
Temple has gone 6-0-3 since losing 2-0 to East Stroudsburg, has played three flat games in a row which resulted in ties against Delaware, West Chester and Drexel.

Penn State is coming off back-to-back 1-0 wins over Shippensburg and East Stroudsburg, and is undefeated in their last six

games (5-0-1).

OFFENSIVE STANDOUTS
George McBrien (OL) and Micky Campion (IR) both have six goals for the Owls. Insider Joe DiSalvo follows with four goals.

Lion Chris Bahr has nine goals in eight games. Tom Kehan has four and Randy Garber three. Bahr had his one-goal-a-game streak snapped at 7 against East Stroudsburg.

DEFENSIVE STANDOUTS
Temple's fullbacks, Arnold Menge and John Albright are former forwards who play well in front of goalie Woody Hartman. Hartman has a 1.09 goals-against average.

Lion fullbacks Bruce Allen and Bob Viehweger. Also Dennis Denard. They're one strong reason why goalie Tim Dantzig has yielded 1.14 goals per game. Dantzig has 42 saves in seven games.

STRENGTHS
Bahr noted Hartman has been steady

and "outstanding" since season began. Ever Diker (HB) is best one-on-one Owl with the ball. His passes spring the forwards loose.

Chris Bahr, Jimmy Startzell, John Marsden and Ciro Baldino give Lions enough speed to run Temple back to North Philadelphia.

WEAKNESSES
Diker, DiSalvo and Albright suffering from assorted leg injuries. One Temple writer also noted that Owls like to pass a lot and play individual soccer, not team soccer.

Penn State still hasn't snapped out of scoring slump. At times Lions look great, then they lull.

PREDICTION
An Owl victory would almost guarantee Temple a bid to the NCAA Tournament. But that's not likely even considering the Owls 9-0 humiliation at Jeffrey Field in 1971. The Lions may not be sharp as yet but they're at least 2 goals better.
