

'I don't know how the hell we won'

It was such an anguishing, frustrating loss for Penn State, and such a sweet, wonderful victory for Navy. Five minutes after the clock had finished the major college football upset of the year to date, a 7-6 giant-killing by 24-point underdog Navy over the Loins in a bitter cold rain at Beaver Stadium Saturday, the Navy lockerroom was bursting apart. There were tears of unrestrained, exhausted glee, and men hugging each other's muddy, sweaty bodies so hard the veins in their arms popped up.

It meant so much to Navy. Years of revenge for being just another addition to Lion coach Joe Paterno's winning percentage.

"I don't know how the hell we won it," Navy coach and former Penn State backfield coach George Welsh hoarsely confessed, sharing his players' exhaustion and falling against the nearest wall.

"It seemed like they were going up and down the field," Welsh continued. "I figured

somewhere along the way they'd break it, but we held on. This is a good squad, and we were lucky enough to get some fumbles. How many did Bahr miss?"

Four, but the reason he was kicking in the first place was the Navy defense. The Middle defensive unit was backed up to the brink time and time again by Lion quarterback Tom Shuman and fullback Tom Donchez, but it stood.

The game story was accurately stepped out on the field between the 30 and 15 yard lines, a sea of mud where Penn State let the game get away.

Seven times Penn State drove past the Navy 30 and put up only six points.

Dykes booted through the game winner.

Mistakes were another aspect of Navy's miracle. Penn State fumbled seven times, losing five.

The final Middle fumble recovery in the fourth quarter had a message in it. The picture is Navy right line-backer Andy Bushak, knocked down, but spotting the loose Penn State fumble five yards away.

Bushak didn't pounce on it, he crawled and dug through the mud on his knees and elbows to get it; and he did, half a second before the Lion backfield arrived.

Navy fumbled three times, losing two, but didn't share Penn State's fumbleitis because, as Welsh said, "We weren't getting to the line of scrimmage."

Trying to figure out how Penn State lost will put you in a tizzy. The Lions made 12 more first downs, 180 more rushing yards, 24 more passing yards, punted farther, returned punts longer and was penalized for fewer yards.

"Penn State beat us pretty good," Welsh said. "The big

thing that kept us in the game was their errors, fumbles and missed field goals."

What happened at the end of all those Lion drives?

The answer provides two convenient scapegoats.

Lion field goal kicker Chris Bahr missed all four times he tried, from 36, 39, 29 and 43 yards. Two went into a strong wind, two went with it.

Donchez fumbled three times, on the Navy 43, 15, and 9-yard lines.

Students were comparing Donchez to John Cappelletti in his fumbling days, but that isn't at all accurate. Donchez is a much better runner now than was Cappelletti was then. His performance speaks for itself: three fumbles; 165 yards in 35 attempts. The fumbles were legitimate, which credits Navy's tacklers.

Then there was the weather, which caused 8,000 no-shows and created thousands of no-stays.

"I don't think the rain helped us," said Welsh, "though I guess it did...it was an equalizer."

Cracked Paterno: "It rained on both sides of the field — at least I think it did. I wasn't over on the Navy side of the field, but it looked like it

was raining over there."

And finally, there was that aborted two-point conversion attempt after Penn State's only touchdown late in the fourth quarter, a five-yard strike from Shuman to split end Jerry Jeram.

The two-point conversion shot is a trademark of Paterno football. "We play to win," Paterno repeated after the contest.

From a winning strategy angle, it made sense. The Lions had to score again to win even with a successful one-point conversion.

"It was a real tough football game," Paterno summarized. "Navy played awfully well. They were alert, well-prepared and deserved to win."

"I told him (Welsh) he did a great job and he certainly deserved to win. If we were going to lose, we might as well lose to a member of the family."
