Release expected today Nixon to leave hospital

LONG-BEACH, Calif. (UPI) - Former President Nixon will be released from Long Beach Memorial Hospital today, barring any last minute complications, ending an 11-day confinement for treatment of a painful phlebitis condition.

In a medical bulletin yesterday, Dr. John Lungren was still not able to pinpoint the cause of Nixon's blood clot but already has ruled out cancer.

"We expect to have enough information from the battery of diagnostic studies on Friday to render a final summary report on the diagnosis, a finalized future treatment plan and course of convalescence," Lungren said.

Earlier yesterday, Nixon's lawyers went before U.S. District Judge John J. Sirica in Washington to ask that subpoenas ordering him to testify in the Watergate cover-up trial be quashed, presumably because of Nixon's illness.

Lungren said Nixon would be released from the hospital Friday if no further complications arise.

"With the exception of the scan that demonstrated the embolus in the lung, all test results to date have been negative," Lungren said.

"If the results from the tests continue to be negative, he will be discharged from the hospital Friday."

A battery of last-minute tests on Nixon yesterday included trips to the hospital's departments of diagnostic ultrasound and nuclear medicine.

Lungren said the purpose of the tests was to determine if Nixon's pancreas is of normal size and appearance. Diseases of the pancreas have been found to be one of the possible causes of phlebitis.

A photographer for the Long Beach Independent Press-Telegram spotted Nixon yesterday as he was being wheeled out of a hospital laboratory section.

The cameraman, Kent Henderson, said Nixon, his cheeks looking sallow, scowled at him in anger, cursed him and was taken back into the lab and by another route to his room.

Lungren said he would hold a noon news conference today prior to Nixon's release.

Nixon was expected to return immediately to his estate in San Clemente for a convalescence of one to three months.

CATA federal funds approved

Federal funds for the Centre Area Transportation Authority have been approved tentatively, but probably will be less than expected.

Ron Short, regional planning director, told the Centre Regional Planning Commission last night the grant will cover the purchase of 14 used Fullington buses, but only eight of 10 planned new buses.

The newly-formed transit authority presently is in the process of buying the Fullington line. The company has said it is losing money and might discontinue service.

The publicly-operated transit system is financed by the borough and surrounding municipalities in cooperation with state and federal transportation departments. The federal government tentatively will pay \$649,000 of the \$811,000 needed to get the buses rolling.

The less-than expected federal subsidy will not affect the new transportation authority, Short said. The two additional buses "really are not needed," he told newsmen after the meeting.

The authority plans to buy six new 45-passenger buses and two new 35-passenger buses in addition to the 14 Fullington buses, most of which are 10 years old and mechanically ailing.

The federal grant also will pay for a maintenance garage to be built near the present borough garages, Short said.

The commissioners endorsed the application for the federal grant after Short said their approval might speed things up in Washington.

Short said after the meeting he expected the federal funds to come through in about two weeks.

The only other major action at the planning meeting was an announcement by Richard Garner of the Centre Citizens Council expressing approval of the recent bypass compromise.

"There will be no lawsuit," he said.

The citizens council, formed last year, has made the bypass its major lobbying issue. Garner said the group will not dissolve now that the bypass issue is nearly over.

The University connector route and the effect of the bypass on Slab Cabin Park are the two key issues still unresolved in the bypass controversy, he said.

The group will shift its emphasis toward environmental protection, Garner said. Centre Citizens Council already is involved in court action against a change in air standards for rural highways, he said.
