

The band's repertoire includes classical, semi-classical, popular selections, choral arrangements, novelty numbers and military music.


The chorus of 24 highly trained vocalists, under the direction of Sgt. Maj. Gene Coughlin, presents special arrangements of well-known compositions at each performance.


