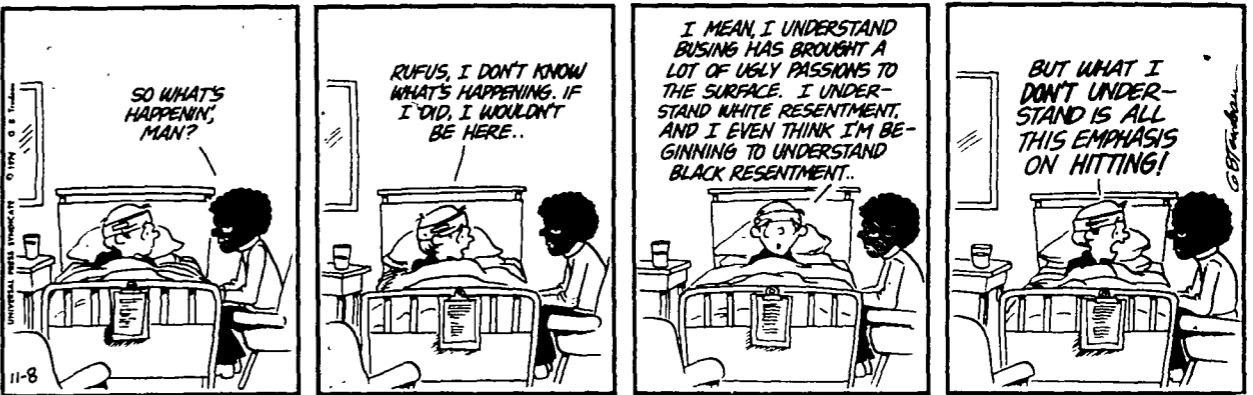

# Nixon on the mend, doctors said

LONG BEACH, Calif. (AP) — Former President Richard M. Nixon was beating the pneumonia in his partially collapsed right lung and his general condition continued to improve, his doctor said yesterday.

The pneumonitis, apparently responsible for partial but nonserious collapse of the lung, was "responding well to antibiotic therapy and resolving," Dr. John C. Lungren said in his written daily report on Nixon.

Lungren added that Nixon's heart rate was no longer being monitored.

Nixon's heart had been monitored by a cardiograph at all times since he went into

near-fatal shock after phlebitis surgery last week, the doctor said. "His cardi- ological status to date has been remarkably stable through all complications," Lungren said.
