Ford sticks to bankruptcy stand

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Five Democratic senators visited President Ford yesterday but failed to soften his opposition to legislation to help New York City and New York state agencies avoid defaulting on their debts.

In other developments, a Senate leader said he thought a filibuster against the bill might be broken. The senator who has raised the filibuster threat agreed and a moderate Republican broke with Ford on the issue.

"I would say he said 'no,'" Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., said after asking Ford during the 75-minute meeting to reconsider his opposition to a loan guarantee bill produced by Proxmire's Senate Banking Committee.

"You can say there is no change in the President's position," deputy press secretary William Greener said.

The Senate bill would provide up to \$4 billion in guaranteed loans and empower a federal board chaired by Treasury Secretary William E. Simon to compel the city to raise taxes

and rent control and reduce pensions, salaries and the city's work force to achieve a balanced budget.

State officials have said the state's housing authority and other state borrowing agencies face the threat of defaulting on their debts by Friday and the city faced that prospect within the next few weeks.

In default, the city would have to file for bankruptcy to retain the ability to pay for essential public safety and health services.

Denenberg hearing ruled no violation

HARRISBURG (AP) — Commonwealth Court has dismissed a consumer group's complaint that a Senate committee violated the Sunshine Law when it acted on the nomination of former PUC Commissioner Herbert Denenberg.

In an opinion yesterday, the court said the Rules and Executive Nominations Committee is not subject to the open meetings law when it deals with executive nominations.

The Consumers Education and Protective Association International Inc., a Philadelphia-based group, had filed suit against Sen. Thomas Nolan, the committee chairman. CEPA said the committee failed to post the required public notice when it met April 8 to send Denenberg's name to the

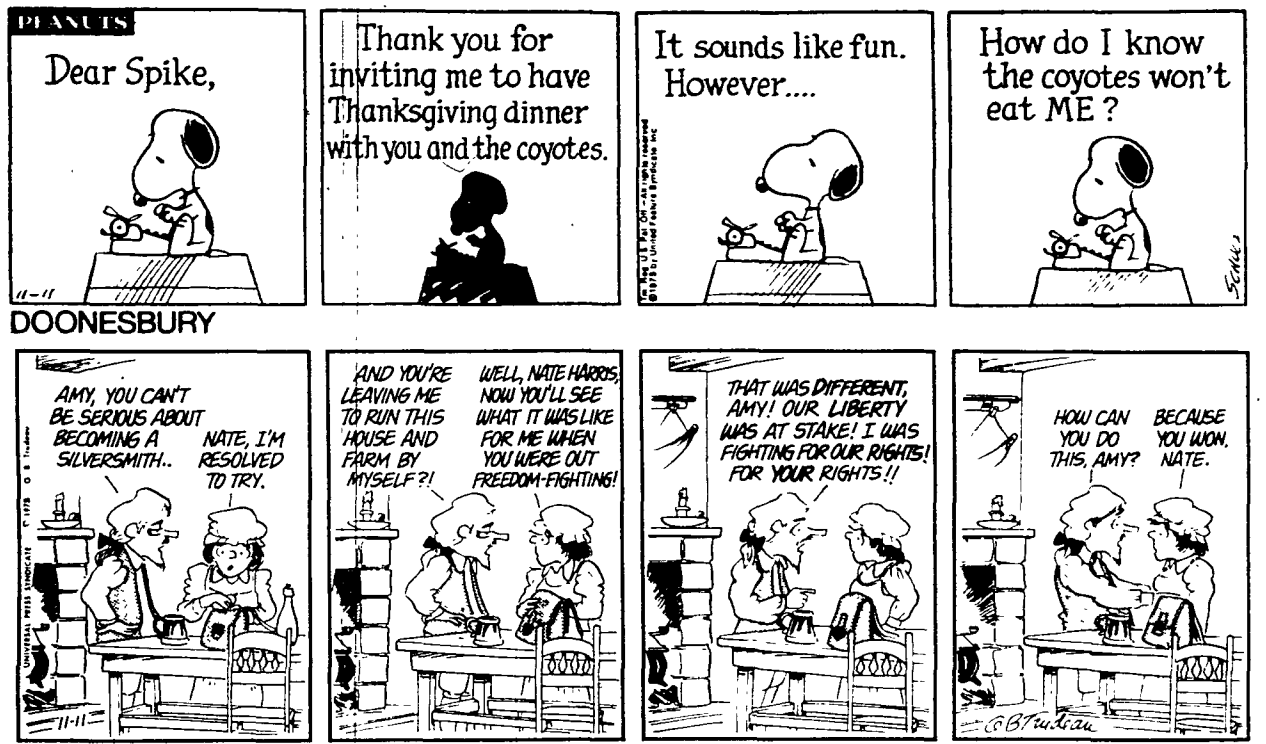
Senate floor. The Senate voted against Denenberg, who was forced to leave Public Utility Commission.

CEPA said the Senate action was illegal because of the Sunshine Law violation.

But the court, upholding preliminary defense objections, said the Sunshine Law covers only those committee meetings where bills are considered or testimony taken.

Even though the committee considered legislation at its April 8 meeting, the action on the nomination does not fall under the Sunshine law, the court said.

CEPA's suit had also named Gov. Shapp, Lt. Gov. Ernest Kline and PUC commissioner James Kelly, who was acting PUC chairman at the time.
