

# Javelinas win NAIA

**KINGSVILLE, Tex. (AP)**—Coach Gil Steinke of Texas A & I University thought he might have to abandon his usual seat in the stands for a game-long seat on the bench for a tough NAIA Champion Bowl football game against unbeaten Salem College of West Virginia.

But he didn't, although he did make 13 trips to the sidelines Saturday as the Javelinas beat Salem 37-0. The Javelinas won their second straight NAIA championship, their fifth over-all and their 26th straight game, building a 23-0 lead against a team that had allowed only 19 points in the first half of 11 prior games. Salem went into the game 11-0.

"I could feel the momentum building up through the early matches," Koll said, "and it was a delightful feeling. I've been on the other side of the mat, so I can appreciate a meet like this."  
Koll's pleasant evening did contain one sour note, when Bill Bertrand ended his 190 bout by exchanging punches with opponent Harold King. Koll was the first to reach the mat and stand between the two, and he immediately scolded the freshman for the flare-up of temper. Overall, though, it was an immensely satisfying night for him and his team.

Decisions by Rich Kepler and Denny Sciabica completed the lightweight sweep for the Lions and left Wolverine coach Bill Johannesen muttering about the failure of his wrestlers to take control of the meet from the start. "I knew we just could not let Penn State get off and running," he moaned, "because you can't catch them in this place."  
Kepler and late fill-in Dave Gilliam were even until Kepler rode the freshman for the entire third period, picking up a stalling point in the bargain, and emerged with a 3-1 win. Sciabica also stayed on top of his man for all of the final three-minute session, thanks to his patented figure four, and came out a 6-2 winner over Karl Briggs.

At this point, the Lions had won 14 straight bouts in dual meet competition (counting the sweep of Buffalo), but Wolverine ace Mark Churella ended the string and upped his record to 9-1 by beating Bill Vollrath. Dave Becker got the lead back up to 13 with a 8-3 win over another substitute, George Kelley.  
Johannesen thought the results at 134 and 158, and possibly the outcome of the whole match, would have been different if undefeated regulars Rich Lubell and Brad Holman had been healthy. "Our injuries didn't hurt them any," he grouched after the match.

The incident overshadowed a fine performance by Denny St. Clair, making his seasonal debut at heavyweight. St. Clair broke up a close bout with a last-period reversal and near fall to whip Mike McDowell, 8-2.  
Thus ended what had promised to be a close match between two excellent teams. Johannesen failed to mention the Lions when asked to name the better teams he's seen this year, but Koll attributed the omission to the pique of a coach whose team has just been blown away.

Wayne Packer got things rolling for the Lions at 118 by taking Greg Haynes down four times en route to a 13-4 superior decision and four team points. Packer led by only 5-3 after the first period, but rode Haynes for most of the second period and finished the match with more than five minutes of riding time.  
Following Packer's lead, Jimmy Earl pulled off the upset of the night at 126 with a 6-2 decision over highly-regarded freshman Amos Goodlow. Goodlow entered the match with a 8-3 mark, but found himself tied with Earl going into the last period. The Lion sophomore picked up four points in the final three minutes, via an escape, takedown, and riding time, and received a standing ovation for his effort.

The Wolverines had their regulars for the last four bouts, but fared little better than they had earlier. Following a now-familiar

pattern, captain Jerry Villecco rode Ed Neiswander for much of his match and won by 5-0. Michigan gained its second and last win in the 177 class, when Mark Johnson defeated Jerry White 5-2 for his tenth straight win of the season.  
The Bertrand-King confrontation followed White's loss, and what appeared to be a second straight Lion loss was nullified by King's disqualification. Bertrand had lost, 3-2, but referee Tom Bailey reversed the outcome when he caught sight of King's right to Bertrand's face. Bertrand claimed innocence, King and Johannesen claimed robbery, and Penn State accepted six points for the disqualification (Michigan was also penalized a team point for flagrant misconduct).  
"It was disappointing and embarrassing," Koll said, "and we accept the blame. It won't happen again."

Denver running back Floyd Little, playing at home for the final time in his brilliant nine-year pro career, raced 66 yards with a third quarter screen pass and ran for another touchdown in the closing minutes, lifting the Broncos to a 25-10 victory over the Philadelphia Eagles in a National Football League game played in frigid weather yesterday.  
Little's first scoring jaunt broke a 10-10 tie, but Jim Turner's extra point attempt was deflected, leaving Denver with a 16-10 lead.  
Four Eagle turnovers in the final period, however, sealed the Denver triumph.  
Turner kicked a 29-yard field goal after one of the turnovers. Turner, who earlier kicked a 47-yard field goal, now has 250 three-pointers in his career, making him only the third man in NFL history to reach that plateau.  
After linebacker Bob Swenson's interception, Little ran two yards for the final score with 1:57 left in the game. It was the 55th career touchdown for Little, who retires after this season.  
The victory, in 15-degree temperatures that led to numerous dropped passes, boosted Denver's record to 6-7. The Eagles dropped to 3-10.
