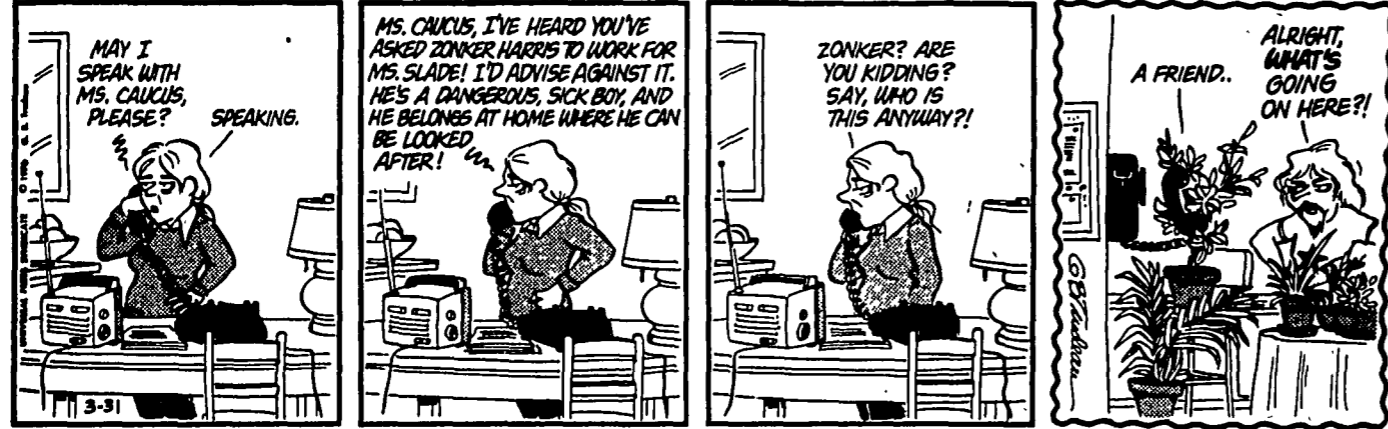
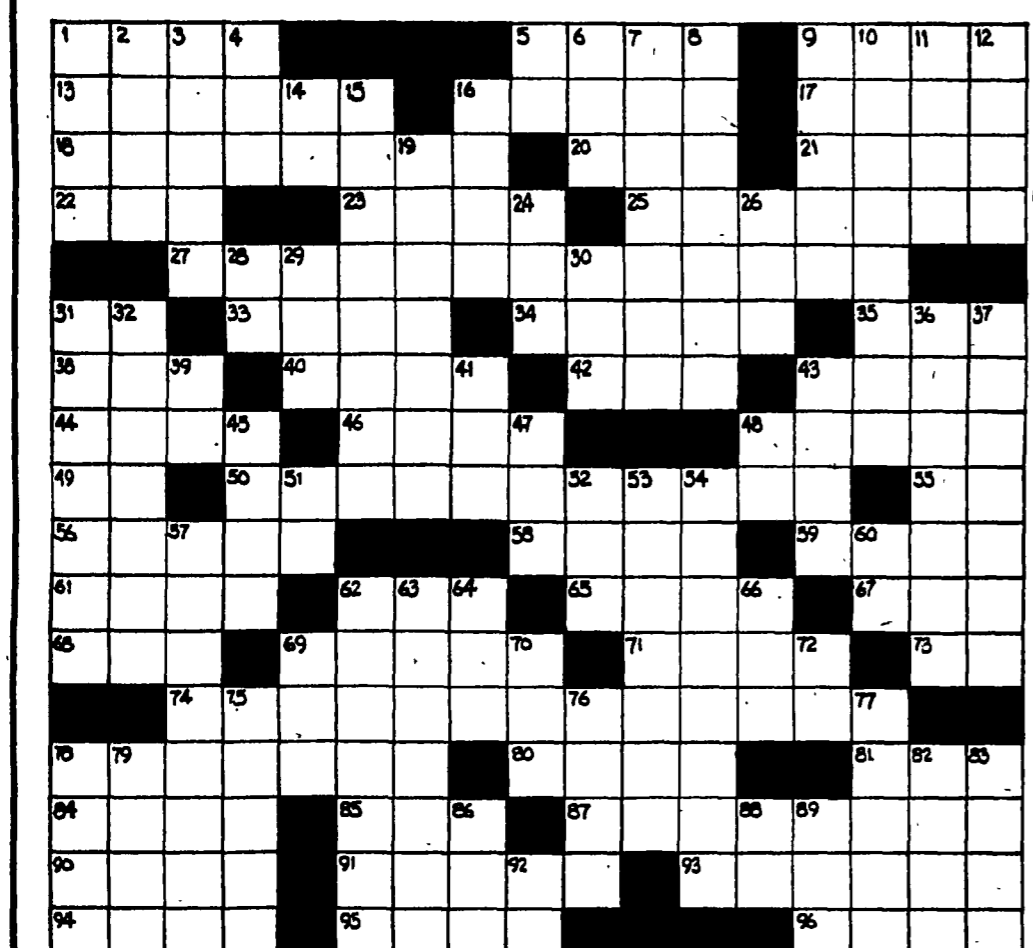

# Dorm requests don't fill space

The Assignment Office received fewer applications for residence hall space than the number available, according to outgoing Association of Residence Hall Students President Sam Malizia.

Assignment Office Manager William Mulberger told Malizia that 12,617 applications were received for about 13,000 spaces. Last year, approximately 15,000 applications were received.

Malizia said anyone who submitted an application should be accepted unless he has indicated unwillingness to live in a converted room.

The exact breakdown listing the number of students accepting conversions should be available today, Malizia said. This should determine whether temporary housing or converted rooms will be changed to their original capacity.

In other business, Malizia outlined the Student Advisory Board's new discrimination policy proposal that, if accepted, would replace procedures currently being used. He said Vice President for Student Affairs Raymond O. Murphy was in favor of the proposal.

Marie Garner, candidate for re-election to the Democratic state committee, urged ARHS to encourage students to register to vote because many issues in Centre County affect them directly. Garner said she fought the move to tax registered students.

Spring Week coordinator Tom Kramer asked ARHS to become involved in Spring Week activities, because this year the event will not be restricted to sororities and fraternities.
