## New grades set for exemptions

Students will receive grades of satisfactory instead of letter grades for scores on undergraduate course exemption tests, the University Faculty Senate decided yesterday; however, they will still get credit for the courses.

Only the group exams that are the initial placement courses will no longer get letter grades, Judd Arnold, head of the senate committee

scheduling, said when introducing the measure to the Senate.

These are the tests that students generally take when they enter the University. No fees are charged for these For advanced exams. courses, where a \$15 per credit fee is charged, students will still receive letter grades.

In other action, the Senate reviewed its policies on

degree programs. The Senate made changes in its present policy in order to clarify it.


To earn a simultaneous degree, a student must earn 30 credits more than he would need to earn for his first degree. He would receive two diplomas. For a sequential degree, a University degree, a graduate after being readmitted, must earn 30 credits meet University requirements for the additional degree.

An amendment proposed by the student senator caucus that requires students to have a 2.0 grade point average instead of a 2.5 average to apply for a simultaneous

simultaneous and sequential degree was approved by a 74-40 vote.

Proposed changes in the wording of the double majors policy was sent back to committee after Senate discussion. All major and college requirements for both majors must be completed to earn a double major. Student transcripts note double majors, however students will only receive one

The Senate also heard a number of informational reports. A survey on tuition reduction programs for University employes showed that many universities have such a program. The Senate also heard reports on grading


