PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Phil Niekro posted his 12th victory and drove in a run with a seventh-inning double last night as the Atlanta Braves defeated the Philadelphia Phillies 2-1.

The Braves took a 1-0 lead off Phillies' starter Larry Christenson, 10-6, in the fifth inning. Willie Montanez slashed the second of his two singles and took second on a single by Cito Gaston. Dave May ripped a one-out single, scoring Montanez.

Atlanta made it 2-0 in the seventh when Vic Correll tripled to right center with two out and Niekro doubled him home.

That kayoed Christenson and brought on reliever Gene Garber, who retired Jerry Royster to end the inning.
