

Congress expenses climb way up

NEW YORK (AP) — A new study shows that Congress spent nearly \$1 billion on itself in the last fiscal year, almost triple what it spent in 1970 and more than five times what it spent in 1960.

The study was developed by the Tax Foundation, Inc., a nonprofit research organization. In a report released yesterday, the foundation said most of the spending increase was due to "the substantial growth of legislative branch employment as well as significant increases in salaries and other costs."

The foundation said that appropriations for the Senate, the House and their joint activities totaled \$426.3 million in fiscal 1976. The sum covers everything from stationery to salaries.

Appropriations for legislative agencies set up by Congress — from the Government Printing Office to the U.S. Botanic Garden — were \$498.3 million.

The total congressional expenditure of nearly \$925 million works out to about \$4.30 for every man, woman and child in the country.

The foundation said the spending level is going to rise still further. "The operating costs of the legislative branch ... are certain within a year or two to reach an annual level of \$1 billion or more," the group said.

It also noted that Congress "determines its own budget which, under law, must be included in the President's budget submission exactly as proposed. It makes its own rules, determines its own staff and salary levels, provides itself allowances and prerequisites..."

"Beyond this, each house makes these determinations for itself. When the annual legislative appropriation bill is acted upon, the House passes only upon its own funds and the Senate later adds in

appropriations for its operations and seldom, if ever, does either body challenge the operations of the other."

The size of Congress' budget is small compared to some items. It is less than 1 per cent of the defense budget, for example, and only about one-fourth of 1 per cent of the total U.S. budget.

But the increase in Congress' spending on itself is bigger than either the boost in the overall federal budget or the rise in the Consumer Price Index.

From 1960 to 1976, the budget for the legislative branch increased 441 per cent; the over-all federal budget grew 305 per cent and the Consumer Price Index went up about 93 per cent. From 1970 to 1976 alone, Congress' budget increased 168 per cent; the total U.S. budget went up 90 per cent, and the CPI rose by 47 per cent.

The foundation said that the number of legislative

branch employees has risen 22 per cent since 1970. The congressional staff alone has grown 44 per cent since 1970. The total civilian labor force grew 12 per cent in the same period and the number of people employed rose 8.8 per cent.

Members of Congress have gotten three pay boosts since 1960 and now earn \$44,625 a year, plus allowances. The House and the Senate voted recently to exclude members of Congress from an automatic, cost-of-living pay raise due Oct. 1 to all federal civil service employees.

Congressional staff salaries vary, but the foundation says levels "are high by almost any standard." It said a report issued in July 1975 estimated the average income of House employees at \$14,000. That compared with a national per capita average income of just over \$5,000.

Dogs without bones demanded

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Consumer groups yesterday asked a federal judge to continue stopping food processors from grinding bone and simmering fat scraps to put into hot dogs and pizzas.

Their attorneys asset threatened further action if the Agriculture Department does not stop the practice. District Court Judge Bryant said he would rule today after hearing consumer and government lawyers.

Justice Department attorney Vincent B. Terlep denied the Agriculture Department's temporarily banned rule allowing use of ground bone and fat scraps was illegal because it was issued without advance public consultation.

He said "mechanically deboned meat" and other by-products are not harmful or adulterated. He said if the regulation remains barred, processors would be free to use such byproducts with

fewer restraints than the regulation provides.

Consumer attorney Daniel Eiroymson, asserting bone and fat products are adulterated, said if the judge continues the temporary ban, consumer groups will ask Agriculture Secretary Earl

Butz to end use of the byproducts.

The products include meat deboned mechanically and meat made by low-temperature rendering of scraps to melt away fat. Agriculture experts contend mechanical deboning could

save a billion pounds of meat a year.

Government spokesmen contend that even if the Agriculture Department regulation remains shelved, processors would still have the legal right to use meat, products in foods.
