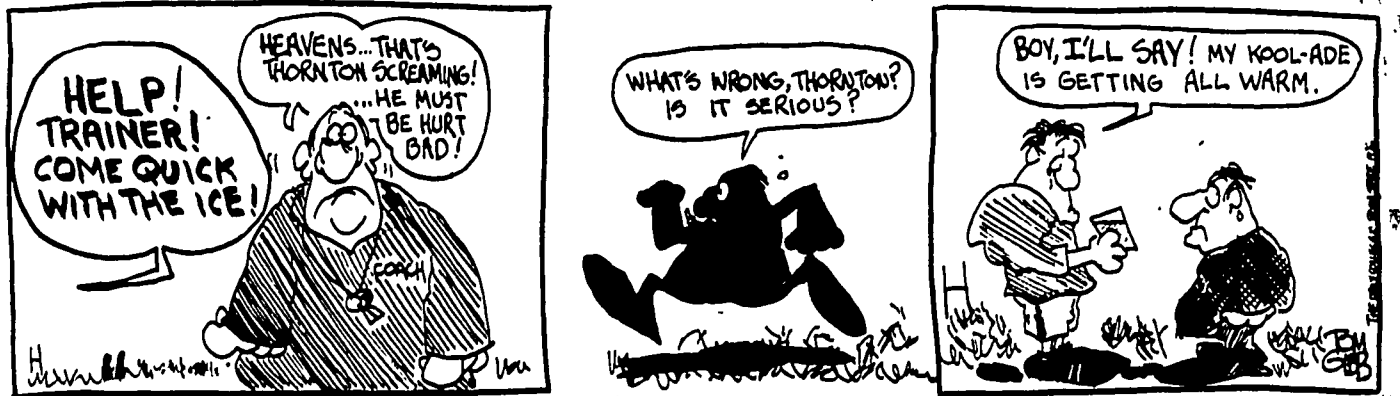

Nixon's memoirs to maintain innocence

NEW YORK (AP) — Former President Richard M. Nixon will maintain in his memoirs that he was innocent of any wrongdoing in the Watergate scandal and the victim of enemies out to bring him down, the New York Times reported yesterday. The Times, quoting knowledgeable publishing sources in Europe and the United States, said Nixon will depict Watergate as a partisan scandal. And though he will express regret he did not question his aides more closely about the Watergate break-in and will admit to an error in judgment, he will deny personal responsibility, the Times said. Nixon will contend he resigned as president to prevent six months of national divisiveness that would have accompanied an impeachment trial, the Times said.
