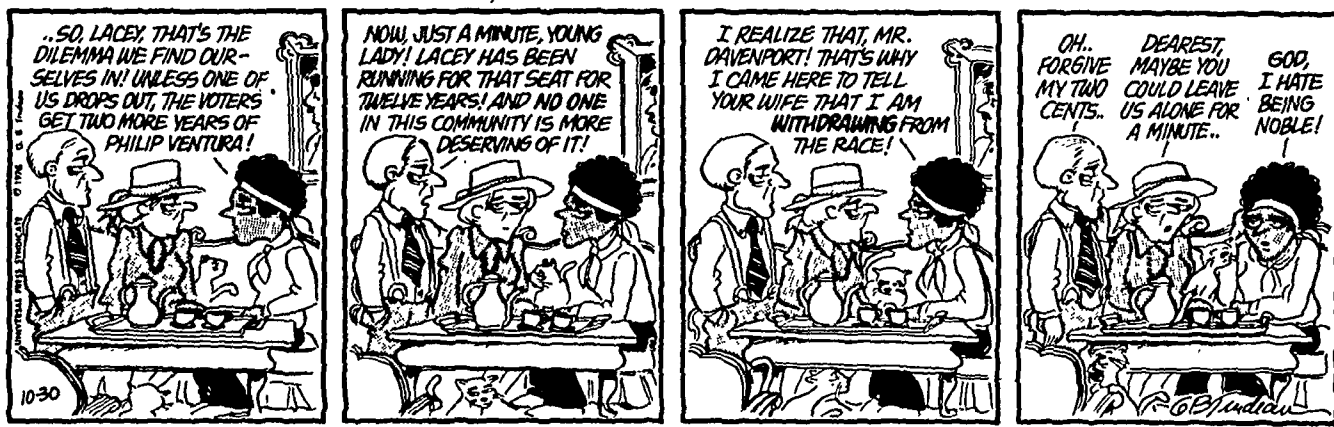
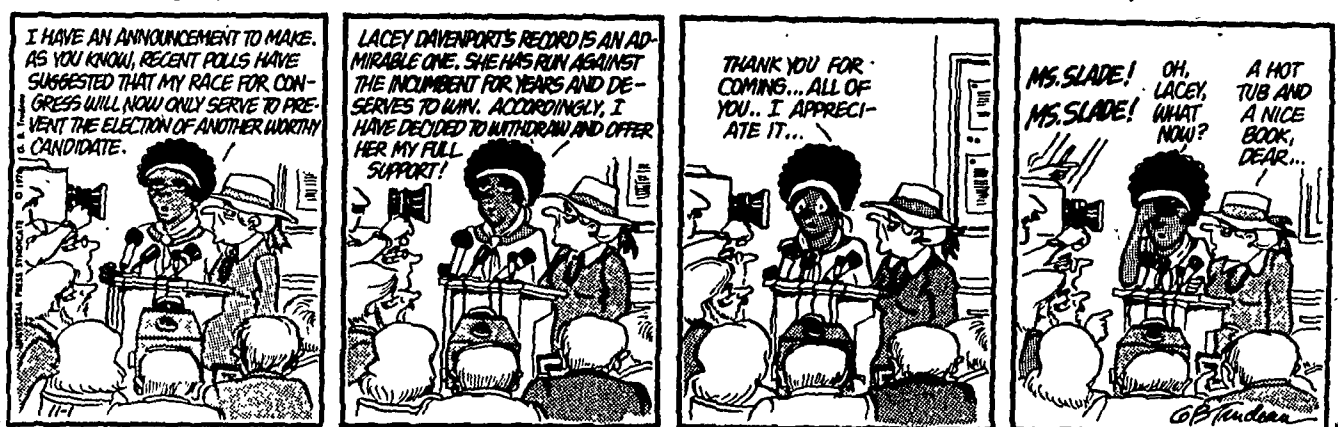

Patrick M. Neff, of Phoenixville, was arrested and charged Saturday with driving under the influence of alcohol. Neff was arraigned before Bellefonte District Magistrate Louise O. Green and held at the Centre County jail in lieu of \$500 bail.

James R. Christenson, of Boalsburg, a driver for Munchies, 108 Sowers St., reported to University police Saturday that he had been robbed of \$11.13 worth of food and drinks by unknown persons.
