His opponent has never faced a primary opponent in his Congressional races, and each time has been the hand-picked choice of the Allegheny County Republican Organization.

His opponent has indicated that he is willing to spend almost \$2 million from his personal fortune to buy this election.

His opponent received \$6,000 in illegal, unreported, cash contributions from Gulf Oil.

His opponent supported Nixon's illegal impoundment of education funds.

His opponent has consistently refused to take a position on investigating Scott and Big Oil.

His opponent opposed the creation of the Energy Trust Fund, and voted to increase the price of oil.

Bill Green has opposed the wasteful and unnecessary defense gimmicks such as the B-1, F-111 and ABM.

Bill Green has a 100% voting record in support of legislation for Senior Citizens, and has fought for Social Security increases.

Bill Green has consistently supported efforts to better the life of rural Pennsylvanians. He supported rural electrification funds, rural water and sewer funds, and flood relief for the victims of Hurricane Agnes in rural counties.
