Volunteer escorts, needed for service

An escort service will be offered this year if the Association of Resident Hall Students and the Interfraternity Council can provide enough volunteer escorts, according to Betty Moore, general counselor of the Student Assistance Center which coordinates the service. "There is no escort service offered now," she said. "Student counselors are waiting for IFC and ARHS confirmation to start the service." Moore said the service began a "few springs ago during a crisis." Girls walking on campus late at night who wanted an escort called the Student Assistance Center. A student counselor matched them with an escort, Moore said. According to Moore, the girl is given the escort's student identification number as a security precaution. 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Volunteer firearms turn-in yields 1 rusty revolver

BOSTON (AP) — A statewide "domestic disarmament race," a chance for people to surrender their guns with no questions asked, produced a grand total of one revolver by yesterday. As Massachusetts police departments waited for the guns that never came, promoters of the turn-in drive admitted that gun owners probably will not give up their weapons unless they are forced to. The only report of a weapon turned in was an old, uncarved for revolver delivered to the police station in Littleton, a suburb west of Boston.

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
