PITTSBURGH (AP) — The officials admitted error and the touchdown was negated, but Pittsburgh Steeler defensive tackle John Banaszak is still celebrating his romp to the end-

"Hey, 20 years from now, nobody will remember it was called back," said the 250-pound ex-Marine, who helped the resurgent Steelers to a 23-0 victory over the San Diego Chargers Sunday.

"The ball's going home with me. I'll have it painted up, with 'touchdown' lettered right on it, and it's going on display." ''To me. it was a touchdown.'

The play began late in the fourth quarter when Charger quarterback Neal Jeffrey sent an errant lateral toward Mercury Morris.

Banaszak, starting in place of injured Ernie Holmes, grabbed the bouncing ball, ran 27 yards to the endzone, then paraded in triumph as the officials and the scoreboard signaled touchdown.

Both teams were lining up for the extra-point as Charger Coach Tommy Prothro ran onto the field to protest, drawing a yellow penalty flag.

Yet Tommy Bell, the officiating chief, ultimately agreed with Prothro that under NFL rules a muffed lateral cannot be advanced by the defense.

The points were taken from the scoreboard, and Pittsburgh took possession at the 27-yard line.

Steeler Coach Chuck Noll, whose team later managed a legitimate touchdown, yesterday praised the officials for the reversal.

"Officials are like defensive backs and offensive linemen: the only time they get any notice is when things go wrong,"

said Noll. "I was very impressed by Tommy Bell and his crew," added the Steeler coach, whose team yielded just seven first downs and 44 rushing yards.

"The touchdown's posted on the board, everybody's lined up, the opposing coach comes running on the field, they throw the flag.

. . . And then when it's pointed out to them that they're in error, I think it takes a heck of a lot of ego-suppressant to take that flag and eat it, and then turn around and take the score of the board.'
