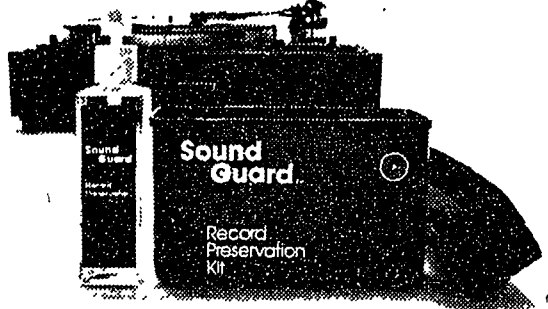

Carter examines labor candidate

ATLANTA (UPI) — President-elect Jimmy Carter yesterday summoned controversial former Labor Secretary John Dunlop for a job interview and scheduled the announcements of two cabinet nominations for today.

Carter also had meetings yesterday with Sen. James O. Eastland, D-Miss., chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, and U.S. District Judge Frank Johnson, an Eisenhower appointee whose

integration rulings had a major impact on Alabama.

Press Secretary Jody Powell refused to confirm a report that W. Michael Blumenthal, chairman of the Bendix Corp. and Jane Cahill Pfeiffer, a former vice president of the IBM Corp., will become secretaries of the treasury and commerce.

Powell said at a briefing that "as late as this morning, Gov. Carter had informed no one of these appointments or any others."

"Any speculation was not based on direct knowledge," Powell said.

UPI learned, however, that the Blumenthal appointment almost was a certainty.

Dunlop, a Harvard

professor and former member of the Ford administration, has been supported for his old job by the unions but opposed by women's groups critical of his lack of initiative on affirmative action programs.

Asked whether Carter was aware of the criticisms, Powell replied, "I assume he's aware of the ones published in the papers."

Five men may still be in the running for selection as Jimmy Carter's secretary of agriculture, Carter's farm campaign director said yesterday.

Washington sources had listed Rep. Bob Bergland, D-Minn., as a "frontrunner" and expected to get the post.

Ohio electoral votes to stay with Carter

COLUMBUS, Ohio (UPI) — A last-ditch attempt to keep Ohio from turning over its 25 electoral votes to President-elect Jimmy Carter was rejected yesterday by a federal judge.

The U.S. Labor, Republican and American parties in the state are charging fraud in Ohio's balloting last Nov. 2. They are considering the possibility of an appeal before the official presidential results become final next month.

U.S. District Court Judge Joseph Kinneary dismissed the suit, which seeks to void certification of Ohio's results and require a new election.

Richard G. Reichel, attorney for the coalition, said there is still time for an appeal before the Electoral College results reach Congress Jan. 6.

Kinneary dismissed the lawsuit less than four hours before state members of the Electoral College met and unanimously awarded Carter Ohio's 25 votes on the basis of his 11,161-vote margin over President Ford, affirmed by a recount.

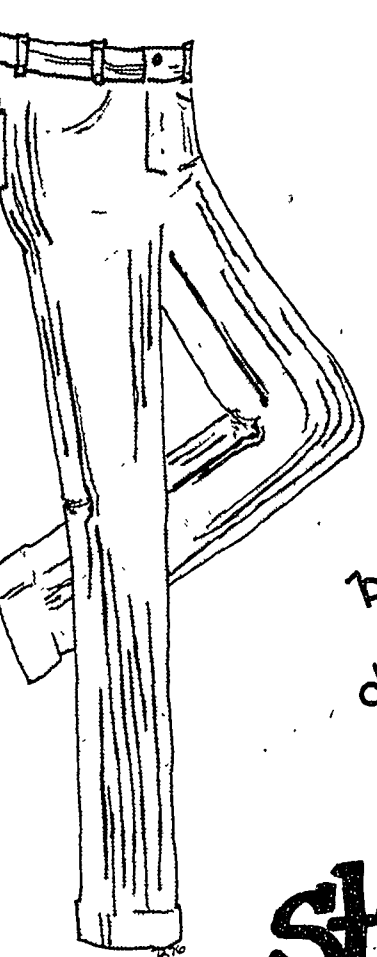
