

## Communist travel easier Carter lifts travel limits

WASHINGTON (UPI) President Carter announced yesterday he is cancelling restrictions on travel to Cuba, North Korea, Vietnam and Cambodia so that the United States does not violate Helsinki Agreement provisions on freedom of movement.

At a news conference, Carter said the longstanding travel restrictions — spanning decades in the case of Cuba and North Korea — will become invalid as of March 18.

The expiring legal provision will simply be allowed to lapse without renewal on that date.

All U.S. passports now carry a stamp prohibiting the bearer from using the document to travel to Cuba, North Korea, Vietnam or Cambodia. Technically, if the host nation were willing, an American could travel to those countries anyway without using the passport.

Thousands have visited Cuba that way since the U.S. travel ban went into effect in 1961, and antiwar delegations visited Hanoi as well during the Vietnam war period.

The North Korean restriction dates from the outbreak of the Korean War in 1950, and the Cambodian ban from the Communist takeover there in 1975.

Even without the passport restriction, American travelers will need visas issued by the four nations themselves.

"I have long been concerned about our own nation's stance in prohibiting American citizens to travel to foreign countries," Carter said in announcing an end to

restrictions.

"We also are quite eagerly assessing our own nation's policies that violate human rights as defined by the Helsinki agreement," which commits signatory nations to allow freedom of movement by their citizens.

He said he wants "to be sure we don't violate these travel rights" and added, "I've instructed the secretary of state to remove any travel restrictions on American citizens who want to go to Vietnam, to North Korea, to Cuba and to Cambodia."

The President also cautioned Americans, however, that the United States still has no diplomatic relations with the four countries involved and said prospects of establishing such relations are "doubtful... at this time."

"So there will be some necessary precautions that ought to be taken by citizens who go there, since we don't have our own diplomats in these countries to protect them if they should have difficulties," he said.

State Department spokesmen also pointed out that Treasury Department restrictions on use of American currency in the four nations are still in effect — meaning a traveler cannot exchange dollars for local currency in any of them or pay bills with dollar travelers checks.

A spokesman said the State Department was consulting with Treasury officials on an announcement on the matter soon.

## Tax plan aids industries

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.), yesterday proposed a major revision in the investment tax credit which would wipe out tax bills for some companies and result in direct federal payments to some others.

Kennedy, in testimony to the Senate Finance Committee on President Carter's tax proposals, also suggested that the 10 per cent investment credit be extended for the first time to nonprofit groups such as hospitals and universities.

Kennedy said his plan would create jobs by encouraging modernization by marginal money-losing industries which cannot now take full advantage of the credit. It would result in a tax cut for business of \$1.1 billion in fiscal 1977 and \$3.4 billion in 1978.

Finance Committee chairman Russell Long (D-La.) a longtime foe of Kennedy's on tax matters, could hardly contain his glee with Kennedy's proposal for a "refundable" credit—one that would be paid even if a company owed little or no tax.

Caught by surprise by Kennedy's testimony, Long grinned and nodded as Kennedy announced his proposal. Afterwards, Long told him:

"Senator, that is a very provocative statement and I'll be in touch with you."

The committee held its second day of testimony on Carter's bill, which contains \$50 tax rebates of payments for more than 90 per cent of Americans, small tax cuts, and business tax incentives.

The House passed the tax package Tuesday, 282 to 181, and the Senate is expected to follow suit when the measure reaches the floor.

Kennedy's proposal would be a substitute for the business tax incentives in Carter's economic stimulus package.

Under current law, companies may subtract from their tax bills 10 per cent of the cost of new plants and equipment. But the credit may not be used to wipe out more than 50 per cent of their tax bills, and if they have excess credits they must carry them forward to future years.

Kennedy said neither the House's new jobs tax credit nor Carter's proposal to increase the investment tax credit would help companies that need it most—"those that were hardest hit by the recession, new businesses and nonprofit organizations."

## Carter offers youth jobs plan

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Carter yesterday proposed three new efforts, totaling \$1.5 billion, to reduce the high rate of unemployment among the nation's young people.

They would include outdoor jobs for youngsters in the country's "open spaces," neighborhood improvement projects, other work and training programs and doubling of the existing Job Corps for disadvantaged youngsters.

Together they would cost \$1.5 billion over the next 18 months and create 200,000 new job and training positions for young people, Carter said.

The President had included the money figure in the economic stimulus

package he recently sent Congress without saying just how it would be spent. He gave the details yesterday in his televised news conference and in a special message to Congress. He noted that 3.4 million youngsters aged 16 through 24 are out of work — about half the total number employed in all age groups. The jobless

rate among those 16 through 19 is 18.5 per cent and exceeds 40 per cent among minority youngsters in some urban areas, Carter said.

His proposals grew out of recent talks between the administration and sponsors of seven youth employment bills pending in Congress. They are not

entirely new on his part but represent a selection, and sometimes refinement, of several of the ideas in those bills.

The package includes doubling the existing Job Corps, in which some 40,000 disadvantaged youngsters now receive job training at special centers around the country.
