SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — A state appellate court yesterday released five followers of the Rev. Sun Myung Moon from the custody of their parents, who had wanted to have them "deprogrammed."

Shortly after the decision was announced, the mother of one of the "moonies" got in a courtroom showing match with a Unification Church member who had tried to embrace her daughter.

The California District Court of Appeal struck down a judge's order granting temporary conservatorship of the five to the parents.
