

Schools examine energy problems

With winter only six months away, State College Area School Board members have already begun to express concern over potential fuel supply and storage problems.

The board agreed last Monday to appoint a committee to examine the feasibility of installing a reserve fuel tank. Physical plant director Frank Brown said a tank with a 100,000-gallon capacity could be installed for \$30,000 and could be filled between July and September when fuel is usually cheaper.

The schools' fuel capacity is now 110,600 gallons, but the schools used up to 2,500 gallons daily at certain times last winter, Brown said.

He said there is also a problem of transporting the heating oil in the winter because it must be trucked in from distant suppliers.

Brown recommended that the proposed reserve tank be located on school district property next to a bus garage on Circleville Road in State College.

According to Brown, another possible site for the tank is at the Westerly Parkway Junior High. Installation costs there, however, would run an additional \$2,500.

In a letter to the school board, local fuel distributor C. S. Myers asked to buy or lease the land next to the bus garage on Circleville Road. This land is adjacent to his property and he said he would use the land to install a fuel tank for his business.

Board member Loretta Jeffreys said there is a definite need for reserve fuel and suggested the board try to reach an agreement with Myers.

In another matter, the board learned from Superintendent of Schools, William E. Babcock, that state funding of a proposed special education program and resource center for the gifted was denied by the Department of Education.

Babcock said he hoped to have several suggestions concerning locally funded programs for disruptive students by next Monday's board meeting when the budget will be discussed.

In other business the board approved personnel recommendations including the appointment of Ronald J. Pavlechko as head varsity coach to replace Jim Williams who resigned to become a University assistant football coach. Pavlechko, a 1971 University graduate and former State College High School assistant coach, will receive a \$2,000 salary increase.
