All-Star teams set

NEW YORK (AP) — Tom Seaver returns to New York this week one month after the Great Trade, and all indications point to his nomination as the National League's starting pitcher in tomorrow night's All-Star Game.

Don Sutton of the Los Angeles Dodgers, another right-hander enjoying a good season with a 10-4 record and 2.59 ERA, had an outside chance of getting the starting assignment, but it's more likely that he'll pitch behind Cincinnati's ace. Like Seaver, Sutton pitched last Thursday and will be well rested.

More recent work would seem to rule out starting berths for Chicago's Rick Reuschel; Steve Carlton of Philadelphia and John Candelaria of Pittsburgh. Joaquin Andujar, the Houston Astros' representative, was injured in a recent game and is a doubtful participant tomorrow night.

Completing the National League pitching staff are relievers Bruce Sutcliffe of Chicago and Gary Lavelle of San Francisco.

Along with Jim Palmer, Vida Blue and Jim Eckersley, the American League pitching staff lists Sparky Lyle of New York, Dave LaRoche of California, Jim Kern of Cleveland and Bill Campbell of Boston.

The American League's starting lineup, voted by the fans, will have Minnesota's Rod



Carew at first base, New York's Willie Randolph at second, Boston's Rick Burleson at shortstop, Kansas City's George Brett at third base, Boston's Carl Yastrzemski, Chicago's Richie Zisk and New York's Reggie Jackson in the outfield and Carlton Fisk of Boston behind the plate.

The National League will have Steve Garvey of Los Angeles at first base, Cincinnati's Joe Morgan and Dave Concepcion at second and short, Ron Cey of Los Angeles at third, Cincinnati's Johnny Bench behind the plate and an outfield consisting of Philadelphia's George Foster, Greg Luzinski of Philadelphia and Dave Parker of Pittsburgh.

Baseball's midsummer night's dream game will start at 8:30 p.m., EDT, with the American League hoping to regain some lost pride. The Nationals have won 13 of the last 14 games.

Bucs split, Phillies win

NEW YORK (AP) — Rookie Steve Henderson's grand slam homer highlighted a tie-breaking six-run explosion in the seventh inning that carried the New York Mets to a 9-3 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates and a split of yesterday's doubleheader.

The Pirates took the opener 3-1 as John Candelaria pitched five shutout innings to earn his 10th triumph before being removed with a recurring back ailment.

Despite the split, third-place Pittsburgh gained one-half game on Chicago and

trails the Cubs by five games in the National League East.

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Jay Johnstone belted two home runs and Steve Carlton became the first 13-game winner in the National League as the Philadelphia Phillies beat the Chicago Cubs 4-2.

The victory pulled the Phils within two games of the division-leading Cubs in the National League East.

The Phillies chased Burris, 9-9, with their fourth run in the seventh.

Floyd joins \$1 million elite

SUTTON, Mass. (AP) Ray Floyd just managed to hold off Jack Nicklaus' last gasp challenge and joined the elite ranks of golf's \$1 million winners with a front-running, two-under-par 69 that staked him to a one-stroke victory yesterday in the Pleasant Valley Classic.

Floyd, who led or shared the lead throughout the last three rounds, claimed the 10th title of his career with a 271 total, 13 under par and a tournament record.

Old pro Julius Boros also broke through the \$1 million barrier and may have written an end to his 28-year pro career.

"I might just retire and go fishing," said Boros, 57. Nicklaus, like all other leading players required to compete in this designated tournament, was in the unhappy situation of finishing second in consecutive weeks, each time with a score that broke the previous tournament record.
