## Paterno's son now conscious after accident

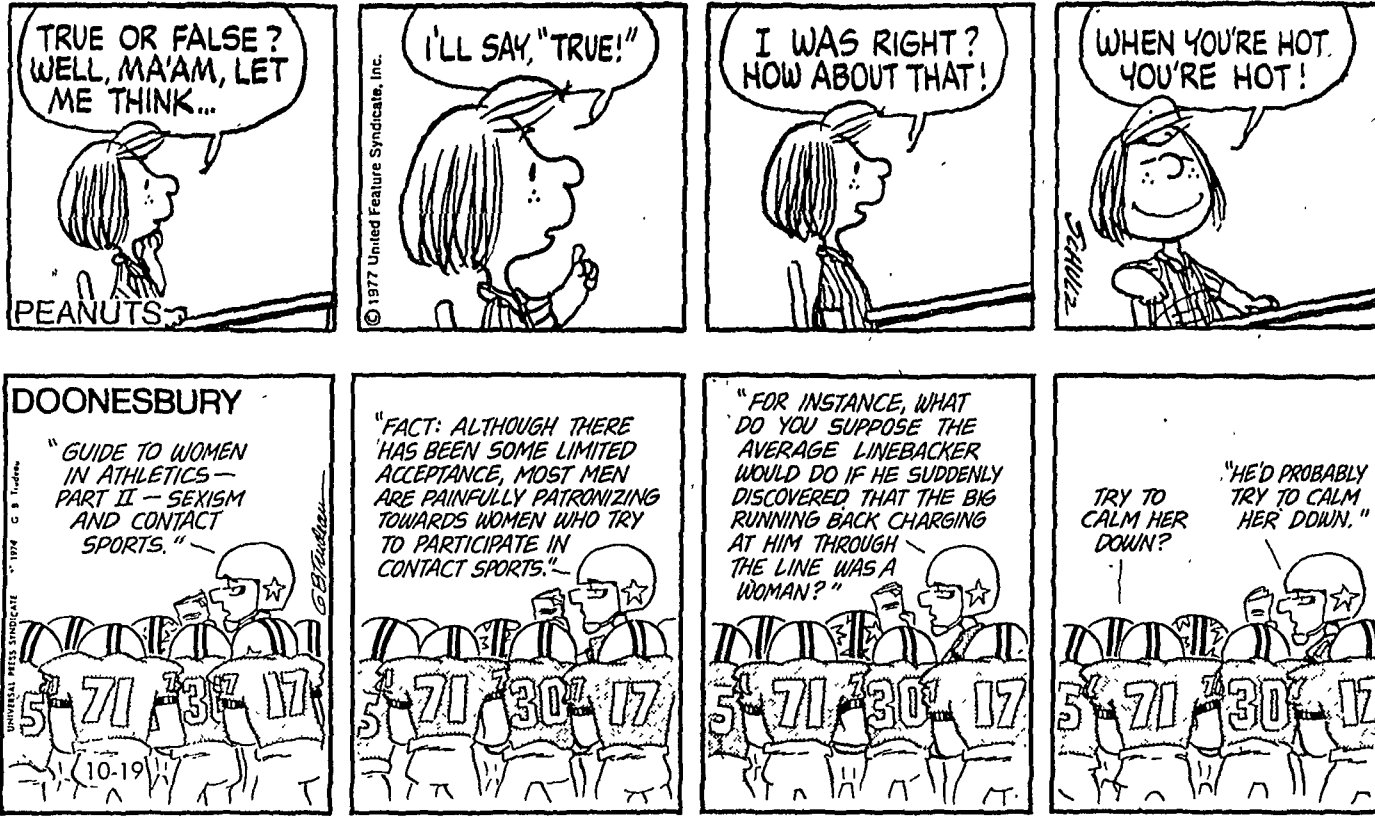
David Paterno, son of Penn State coach Joe Paterno, regained consciousness yesterday afternoon after being knocked unconscious Friday in a trampoline fall.

Although the 11-year-old boy remained in serious condition in Geisinger Medical Center in Danville, he improved steadily and recognized and responded to family, according to a hospital source.

Supportive measures for David were gradually being discontinued, the hospital spokesman said.

The spokesman said the boy's father returned to State College yesterday while his mother and other family members remained in Danville, about 60 miles from State College.
