Born unto us classical choices

The holiday season is again upon us and record stores abound in albums of festive cheer. Here are some suggestions to give Santa when he fights the battle of the bulge down your

chimney this year. Christmas would not be the same without the much-recorded, overly hackneyed "Messiah" of Handel. Colin Davis's recording with the London Symphony Orchestra and Chorus (Phillips SC71AX300) will give the most satisfaction. The complete score is recorded using the original orchestration.

Sir Thomas Beecham's 1959 recording with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and Chorus has been re-issued on RCA Gold Seal.

Hermann Scherchen's recording with the Vienna State Opera Orchestra and Academy Chorus (Westminster Gold, WGS-8163) may not suit some because of Scherchen's erratic tempo changes.

For the budget-minded, Sir Malcolm Sargent's recording with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra and Huddersfield Choral Society (Seraphim SIC-6056) will suffice. An abridged version worthy of note is


Eugene Ormandy's recording with the Philadelphia Orchestra and Mormon Tabernacle Choir (Columbia M2S-607). Since it was issued in 1959 it has become a Gold Record winner, selling more than

a million copies. Choral versions of carols abound and Choir (Columbia XMS-6777, XMS-6192, XM-30077, XMS-6100, M-34546, and MS-6499, the latter with Leonard Bernstein and the New York Philharmonic) will

any version by the Mormon Tabernacle singers who have recorded Christmas fare. Even great Jewish singers such as Jan Peerce, Richard Tucker and Robert Merrill have done it, the latter recording a complete album of favorites.

An album of special interest is-"A Golden Age Christmas" (RCA Victrola VIC-1682) which contains historic recordings by such greats as Enrico



Among orchestral collections with or without chorus, a disc by Eugene Ormandy with the Philadelphia Orchestra and the Temple Concert Choir (Columbia MS-6369) is outstanding for the performances and the sonics: it is a

Gold Record winner, also. Opera fans have their choice of great

Caruso, John McCormack, Giovanni Martinelli, Tito Schipa, Rosa Ponselle, Ernestine Schumann Shumann-Heink and Louise Homer in holiday music.

In all fairness, I must say a word about Chanukah music. A best bet is Jan Peerce's album "The Art of the Cantor" on Vanguard 79237.






