

Binney and Bewley lead swimgals' win

West Chester never had a chance Monday afternoon at the Natatorium as the Lady Lions swam circles around the Rammettes and captured 13 first places. Led by double-winner Carol Mazzer (100-yard butterfly and 200-yard freestyle) and the national qualifying diving off the 3-meter board by Becky Binney and Katie Bewley, Penn State (2-1) coasted to a 97-34 win.

With scores of 246.60 and 246.40 respectively, Binney and Bewley earned the right to go to AIAW national championships to be held in March at Duke University.

No records fell, but three Lady Lions missed breaking team marks by under one second.

Freshman Katie Gould, a former State College High star, missed Cindy Fry's record by five-tenths of a second in the 50-yard butterfly.

Mazzer, a sophomore from New York State, missed her own record in the 100 butterfly by six-tenths of a second. And sophomore Lizanne Hendershott fell short of Fry's record in the 50-yard backstroke by eight tenths.

Lady Lion coach Ellen Perry was pleased with her swimmers' per-formances as Penn State qualified four more women for the eastern championships.

"Our people seem to be on the track for nationals," Perry said. "Now is the time in the year — late January, early February — for our swimmers to be hitting times for Easterns and starting to hit national times."

West Chester coach Susan Parkinson said her swimmers had the same times they normally do in practice, "but we had outstanding performances in the breast and butterfly."

Parkinson said the fact that this was West Chester's first meet of the season may have hampered her swimmers. 'We had to get the first meet jitters out

somewhere," she said. "Penn State is a nice solid team with a lot of depth," Parkinson said. "They can

look forward to a good season."


