Borg, Connors advance

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Bjorn Borg, Wimbledon title holder from Sweden, joined Jimmy Connors in the quarterfinal round of the \$225,000 U.S. Indoor Pro Tennis Championship Thursday night after coming within two points of a loss to 22-year-old Peter Fleming, Chatham, N.J.

An intense struggle of almost two hours ended with Fleming serving a double fault to hand the No. 2 seeded Borg a third round victory by 3-6, 7-6, 6-3.

Connors, the top seed from Los Angeles, experienced no such difficulty in dispatching England's Buster Mottram 6-1, 6-4.

Fleming made good use of his 6-foot-5 frame to pound the ball over with his service and make things tight for Borg throughout the match.

Fleming scored with well placed volleys and drives down the line to dominate the first set, which he won with a service ace.

Borg held on and the second set was decided by a tiebreaker in which Fleming was two points from winning at 5-5. Borg then hit a stinging drive from behind the baseline which struck the net and shot past the charging Fleming. That put Borg at 6-5.

Fleming tied at 6 all as Borg overdrove the base line. A strong serve by Borg drew a netted backhand for 7-6 and Fleming later hit Borg's shot over the baseline to lose the set.

Borg, who broke through Fleming's service in the third game of the third set, reached match point by hitting an overhead smash to Fleming's feet as he

moved toward the net. Fleming's return hit the net before he double faulted on service.

In other third round matches, John McEnroe, of New York, defeated No. 5 seeded Manuel Orantes, of Spain, 7-6, 6-2.

Sandy Mayer, of Wayne, N.J., upset his doubles partner, fourth seeded Vitas Gerulaitis, 6-2, 7-5 in an earlier match Thursday.

Mayer, the No. 15 seed whose father was a Hungarian Davis Cup player, broke through Gerulaitis' service to lead 5-2 in the first set. He won the set in the next game when Gerulaitis hit a backhand drive into the net.

The victory put Mayer into the quarterfinal round, good for \$4,500. Gerulaitis takes away \$3,000.

Takes San Diego Open lead

Pfeil 'got tired of playing poorly'

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Mark Pfeil, who once lost his playing rights because of poor performance, ripped 6 shots off par over his last eight holes and with a 66 swept into the first round lead Thursday in the \$200,000 Andy Williams-San Diego Open Golf Tournament.

"I got a few breaks, but I think the main thing was I just got mad, just got tired of playing poorly on the tour," the 26-year-old Pfeil said after taking a tournament lead for the first time in his pro career.

Pfeil, who lost his approved players card after winning only \$500 in 1975 before regaining it in 1976, held a 1-stroke margin over hometown boy Jack Spradlin, whose 67 was his best round as a pro.

Spradlin also has had a checkered, in-and-out pro career. He, too, lost his card through lack of performance, sued the PGA Tour to regain it, dropped the suit, then won back his playing rights with a successful appearance in 1977 at the tour's qualifying school.

Both Pfeil and Spradlin played the 6,667-yard North course at Torrey Pines, the shorter and easier of the two courses used for the first two rounds. The South course measures 7,047 yards. Each plays to a par 72.

Tom Watson, a two-time winner this year, defending champion here and heavily favored to win again, could do no better than a 72 on the North.

Johnny Miller toured the North in 71 in sunny, cool weather.

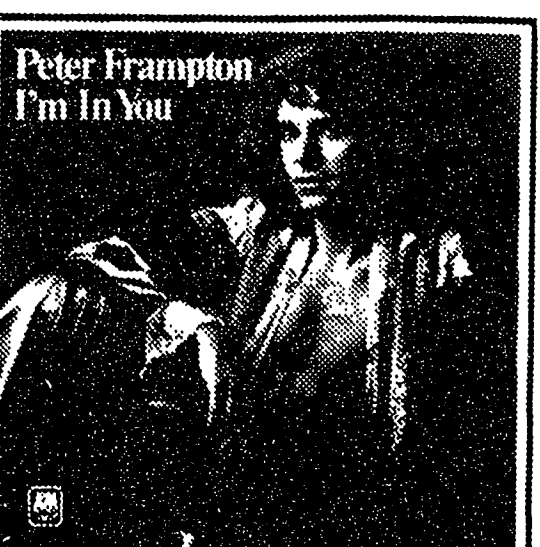
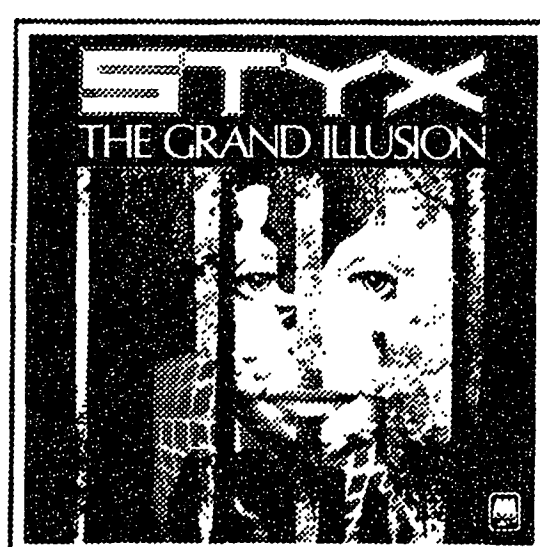
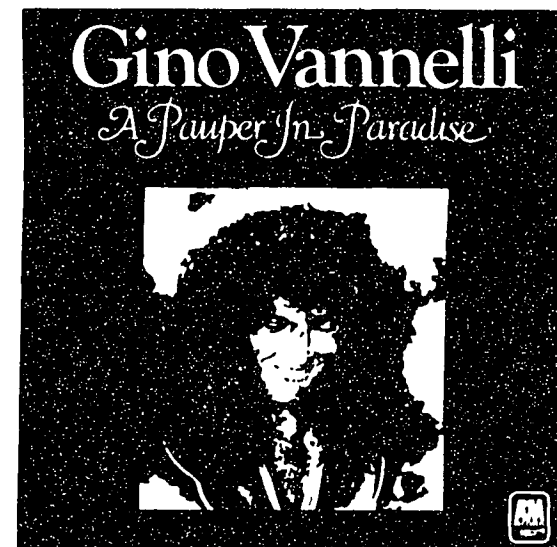
