# Moon, of The Who, dies of natural causes

LONDON (AP) - Keith Moon, the wild, raucous drummer of The Who rock group, was found dead Thursday by his fiancee hours after announcing their engagement at a party.

The cause of death was not immediately known, but a spokesman for Moon said he did not die of a drug

"This is the first thing people think of," the spokesman said, "but he died of natural causes."

Moon, 31, known as the wild man of rock because of his crazy stunts, announced his engagement to Annette WalterLax, a 28-year-old Swedish model, at a party Wednesday night given by former Beatle Paul McCartney.

In 15 years The Who has been one of the world's most popular rock groups, possibly best known for the rock opera

## lashville man barricades himself in house

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI) - A man barricaded in his house with an arsenal ranging from machine guns to tomahawks steadfastly refused to surrender Thursday night — even when officers snatched his elderly aunt off the

front porch and cut off his electrcity.

Don Davis, 40, holed up in his house Thursday morning when police arrived to arrest him on a warrant charging him with making terroristic telephone calls to a woman in Kansas.

No shots had been fired in the day-long siege, although neighbors reported the house was an arsenal containing machine guns, rifles, shotguns pistols and even tomahawks.


"I think he's highly dangerous," said Assistant Police Chief Paul Uselton, "If we stormed the house right now we probably would have to kill him and some of our officers might also die."

"It's a waiting game," Uselton said. "We could be here all night. He's given no indication that he is coming out and has told us that he doesn't mind being killed."






