

**Dies shortly after announcing engagement**

**Moon, of The Who, dies of natural causes**

LONDON (AP) — Keith Moon, the wild, raucous drummer of The Who rock group, was found dead Thursday by his fiancée hours after announcing their engagement at a party.

The cause of death was not immediately known, but a spokesman for Moon said he did not die of a drug overdose.

"This is the first thing people think of," the spokesman said, "but he died of natural causes."

Moon, 31, known as the wild man of rock because of his crazy stunts, announced his engagement to Annette Walter-Lax, a 28-year-old Swedish model, at a party Wednesday night given by former Beatle Paul McCartney.

In 15 years The Who has been one of the world's most popular rock groups, possibly best known for the rock opera "Tommy."

**Eighth bomb in six days explodes in Indianapolis**

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Litter is suspect and night school activities have been suspended in the Speedway section of this Midwest city, where eight homemade bombs have exploded in six days.

"If you see something, don't touch it, don't kick it, don't drive over it," Assistant U.S. Attorney Bernard Pylitt warned after the eighth bomb injured three people.

"We'd rather come out and look at a bag of grass clippings than have a bomb explode on somebody," Pylitt said.

Authorities, puzzled because no one has claimed responsibility for the bombings, have no suspects and no clues, he added. A dozen federal

agents are aiding city police in the investigation.

Businessmen offered a \$1,000 reward Thursday for information about the bombings, which are believed to be the work of a single person.

School officials held classes, but canceled outdoor recess for elementary pupils and said they would not penalize students who stayed home. School doors were locked to outsiders.

"We're of the opinion that darkness gives the mad bomber an advantage. It's his chief ally," said Speedway School Superintendent Dale Weller, who called off Friday's football game with rival Mooresville.

**Nashville man barricades himself in house**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI) — A man barricaded in his house with an arsenal ranging from machine guns to tomahawks steadfastly refused to surrender Thursday night — even when officers snatched his elderly aunt off the front porch and cut off his electricity.

Don Davis, 40, holed up in his house Thursday morning when police arrived to arrest him on a warrant charging him with making terroristic telephone calls to a woman in Kansas.

No shots had been fired in the day-long siege, although neighbors reported the house was an arsenal containing

machine guns, rifles, shotguns pistols and even tomahawks.

"I think he's highly dangerous," said Assistant Police Chief Paul Uselton. "If we stormed the house right now we probably would have to kill him and some of our officers might also die."

"It's a waiting game," Uselton said. "We could be here all night. He's given no indication that he is coming out and has told us that he doesn't mind being killed."

Davis' aunt, Sudie Murbury, aged about 70, remained with him in the house and as dusk approached astonished

police watched her walk out the front door and sweep the front porch. A short time later she came out with a bag of

garbage and an officer lurking nearby grabbed her and carried her bodily to police lines outside the house.
