

## Department revamping activities

The USG Department of Commonwealth Campuses is revamping its budget proposal to get funds from Associated Student Activities, Rose Kouri, director of the department, said.

The department is working without any funds and the new proposal will detail some of the projects being planned by the department, Kouri said.

The reason the Department of Commonwealth Campuses has not received any funds from ASA is because it does not serve University Park students directly, said Mark Bell, chairman of the ASA Budget Committee. According to

the criteria packet the department would have to demonstrate to ASA that it serves University Park students before it can receive any funding, Bell said.

"It is vital to have a program for Commonwealth Campus students. As of now, orientation is geared toward freshmen coming here. We need something for transfer students," Kouri said.

Tony Filippello, a department member who is working on the budget rewrite, said the money is needed to put into practice programs which are now only in the planning stage.

The department is working with the Council of Branch Campus Student Governments and is having a program at 8 tonight in 225 HUB. Speakers will include Tony Cortese, USG vice president and Bonnie Northrup, USG federal liaison.

The first COBCSG meeting will be at 9 a.m. Saturday in 301 HUB, Doug Wayner, COBCSG coordinator said. On the agenda will be the election of a COBCSG chairperson, and Commonwealth Campus representatives to the University Board of Trustees.

## Energy fair set for late October

A program to acquaint central Pennsylvanians with energy saving ideas and techniques will be held Oct. 26, 27 and 28 at the Nittany Mall.

An energy extension fair, co-ordinated by University Energy Extension Services will feature exhibits, speakers and presentations on various aspects of energy conservation.

The fair is a project of Centre Region Council of Governments, which is very concerned about depleting natural fuels, according to

Carl Zietlow, co-ordinator for Energy Extension Services and the COG Energy Conservation Steering Committee.

"There is some question as to whether we're going to have oil and gas past this century," he said. Zietlow said COG hopes to educate people in energy conservation to stretch fuel supplies.

Local companies and businesses are being invited to participate in the fair, which will be held during the mall's 11th anniversary celebration.

Building and manufacturing firms serving the home owner such as utility companies, contractors, heating, insulation, lumber and home siding companies will exhibit displays about conserving energy.

The program will feature speakers and technical specialists dealing with topics from wood-burning to solar energy. Safety codes and regulations will be covered and specialists will answer questions from viewers.
