

Carter proposes new education department

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The administration yesterday proposed the creation of a Department of Education, and promised Congress it would be trim and efficient with a \$13.5 billion budget and 16,000 employees.

President Carter attempted to cut the educational programs free of the other cabinet departments last year, but the proposal bogged down and died in the last days of the 95th Congress.

In a briefing for reporters and later in testimony to the Senate Governmental Affairs Committee, budget director James McIntyre promised greater efficiency and accountability, plus a stronger voice for education issues.

As outlined by a White House statement, the new department would give education programs the high-level leadership that is unavailable through the current structure.

"The new department would include more than 150 programs now handled by the departments of Health, Education and Welfare, Defense, Justice, Housing, Agriculture and Labor.

"The bill would leave most school nutrition programs within the

Agriculture Department, leave Indian education to the Bureau of Indian Affairs and leave vocational rehabilitation within HEW, but would include education for migrants.

The proposed departmental budget comes to \$13.5 billion — larger than five other cabinet departments — and calls for a workforce of more than 16,000. McIntyre noted that while education accounts for just 8 percent of the federal budget, educational programs make up 40 percent.

Committee members pressed McIntyre and Education Commissioner Ernest Boyer to explain how another department might improve services.

Boyer said he had never met privately with Carter or attended a cabinet meeting. But he and McIntyre said all that would change under a new department.

Effectiveness, said McIntyre, would be enhanced because Carter would get greater input from a ranking cabinet member, and he promised that "programmatic efficiencies can be achieved both in the short-term and in the long-term."

Kissinger turns down bid for Senate race

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, who may run in the Senate in New York state next year, has turned down a bid by some Republican leaders to make the race in Connecticut.

Kissinger lost the major advantage he had in the New York race last month with the death of his political mentor and potential financial backer, Nelson Rockefeller.

Wednesday, Kissinger wrote a letter to Fred Biebel, the Connecticut GOP chairman, saying "under no conceivable circumstances would I become a candidate."

The letter came the same day the New York Times reported Biebel was meeting with Kissinger and former Sen. James Buckley of New York to discuss running against Democratic Sen. Abraham Ribicoff if he seeks another term next year.

Biebel's attempt to maneuver an outsider into the race is said to have angered Sen. Lowell Weicker, who as the highest elected Republican in Connecticut is considered the party's leader in the state.

Kissinger and Weicker are old foes — the senator refused to vote for his confirmation as secretary of state. Moreover, Weicker is opposed to a "carpetbag candidate."

The report that Kissinger might run for the Senate in Connecticut was linked to a story that he would join the faculty at Yale to establish his credentials as a resident of the state.

"I would consider it highly inappropriate to change my residence simply to become eligible for elective office," Kissinger wrote. "I have not discussed a teaching position with Yale since 1977 ... It would be incompatible with my respect for that great institution to reopen that issue to facilitate my entry into state politics."

It was reported that Rockefeller had been grooming Kissinger for a Senate race in New York — where the late Sen. Robert F. Kennedy successfully campaigned in an adopted state.

But Kissinger would face strong opposition in a Republican primary. Sen. Jacob Javits may run again in 1980, and it is expected conservative Rep. Jack Kemp also will run.
