Stamatis is a contender for 1980 Olympic team

Jim Stamatis, Penn State's All-American soccer forward, has been named as one of 22 top candidates for probable selection to the United States Olympic soccer team.

The United States Soccer Federation, which sponsors both the nation's Olympic and National teams, chose Stamatis from a pool of about 60 players that remain under consideration for final selection to the Olympic team.

However, the U.S. entry must survive a series of qualifying matches before it can compete in the 1980 Moscow Olympics. It failed to do so in preparing for the 1976 Montreal games, losing to Mexico in its final qualifying game.



Stamatis, who played on the U.S. 20 year-old and-under team in an eight-nation tournament held in Switzerland last spring, said he had more than an inkling that he would be chosen for the Olympic team.

"The time I was really thrilled was when I went to Florida last spring for the semi-final tryout," the Bethlehem, Pa. native said. "From then on I kept going on every trip."

Walter Bahr, Penn State soccer coach, said the timing of Stamatis' selection is just perfect for the junior forward who notched 13 goals and eight assists for the 11-1 Lions last fall.

Bahr said. "It'll be possible for him to play both collegiately and in the Olympics. He'll be available for the pro draft when he graduates. So, it's possible for Jimmy to play professionally and in the 1980 Olympics."

Only three players in Penn State soccer history have scored more points than the 6-0, 170-pound Stamatis. With 36 career goals and 17 assists, for 53 total points, Stamatis trails only Rich Reice (54), Dick Packer (57) and Chris Bahr (67).

Bahr said that under International Olympic rules, Stamatis would be able to play professionally for a set fee, and still be eligible for the Olympic games.

"If he avoids injury he should be a prime candidate for the 1980 team,"

Bahr said. "Jimmy looks like he's in that top group of 22."

Last month, Stamatis competed on the Olympic team's successful California tour. The U.S. contingent defeated Canada, 2-0 in Seattle, and Mexico, 4-0 in Los Angeles. Stamatis is optimistic about the U.S. team's chances of qualifying for the 1980 games.

"I think we're quite a bit better," Stamatis said, comparing this team to the squad that failed to make the 1976 Montreal Olympics. "A lot of us have had international competition and we haven't lost a game to any team in our age group."

Stamatis said the U.S. team is preparing for an April mini-tournament in the Bahamas with Canada and Mexico, followed by the June Pan-American Games in Puerto Rico.

Edinboro challenges lady cagers

Edinboro's women's basketball team is every bit as good as its 15-5 record indicates, and even more so whenever it plays Penn State. The two teams clash at 7 tonight in White Building.

Earlier this season in the Pitt Invitational, the Lady Lions, 15-6, edged the Lady Scots, 82-77. At one point in that game, Penn State owned an 11-point lead, but gradually lost it.

Both teams had phenomenal shooting percentages; the Lady Lions shot 53.1 percent and Edinboro hit 52.5 percent of their shots. Four lady cagers scored in double figures for Penn State: Jen Bednarek, 23; Sue Martin, 16; Janet Gabriel (who came off the bench and hit on six of seven shots), 13; and Nancy Kuhl, 12.

Last season, after soundly beating Edinboro twice during the regular season, 73-36 and 90-78, the fourth

seeded Lady Lions were upset by the Lady Scots, 85-81, in the first round of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Mid-Atlantic Satellite Tournament.

"They are a team that has a tradition of showing hustle, good man-to-man defense, and aggressive play," Lady Lion coach Pat Meiser said. "They are true competitors, and they always have been. They'll be up for us, I'm sure."

Edinboro, coming off a 76-60 victory over Lock Haven Saturday, is averaging 72 points per game; Penn State is averaging 78.3. Three of Edinboro's five losses have been to nationally ranked teams — Old Dominion (No. 1), Maryland (No. 7), and Penn State (No. 13).

Sophomore guard Lori Dolby is leading the Lady Scots' attack, averaging 16 points per game, 4.5 points higher than last year. Joining Dolby in the backcourt is junior Audrey Scott. Scott, a returning starter, trails only Dolby in scoring, averaging 10.3 points per game.

Defensive leaders are Donnee Disco and Tina Skidmore. Disco, the Lady Scots' 6-4 junior center, is averaging 6.4 rebounds per game, and Skidmore has pulled down 6.2 per game. Skidmore is also averaging 9.4 points per game and is the only other returning starter, besides Scott, in the starting lineup.

Edinboro has suffered some key losses in personnel due to personal difficulties. Barb Moran, Kathy Nelson, and Helene Gauffin walked off the team.

Senior co-captains Moran and Nelson averaged 7.5 and 12.3 points per game respectively last season. Meiser said that Moran was a dangerous player in that "she had the potential to break a game open at any time."

"Edinboro is very similar to us," Meiser said. "They like to run and they like to play man-to-man defense. We're going to have to shoot the ball well, watch our fouls, and get back into our man-to-man because we haven't used that in our last two or three games."

Knicks deal McAdoo to Boston for draft picks

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Knicks announced yesterday the team traded high-scoring forward Bob McAdoo to the Boston Celtics for three first-round draft choices.

Boston is to deliver the No. 1 choice of Golden State and Seattle as well as the Celtics' top pick to the Knicks for McAdoo, the three-time National Basketball Association scoring champion. Boston owned the Golden State and Seattle choices as a result of earlier transactions.

The Knicks were without a first-round selection in the NBA draft,

having shipped two No. 1 picks to Seattle.

"Bob McAdoo is a great player and a fine person but we haven't been winning many games," said Sonny Werblin, president of Madison Square Garden Corp., which owns the Knicks.

The McAdoo swap was negotiated by Werblin and Celtics co-owners John Y. Brown and Harry Mangurlian. Word of the trade took lower echelon employees of both organizations by surprise.
