

Bhutto execution plea to be heard in court

RAWALPINDI, Pakistan (UPI) — Lawyers for condemned former Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, hoping new hearings may take months, won a Supreme Court agreement yesterday to hear pleas for a stay of execution.

In London, Bhutto's two sons swore revenge if their father dies, and said his execution could provoke violent upheaval in Pakistan.

"My blood will boil, and I'll go back to Pakistan and take revenge," Shah Nawas Bhutto, 20, told a news conference.

"If, God forbid, Mr. Bhutto is executed, I have no doubt that over 80 percent of the electorate will not put their votes in the ballot box. They will put them on his grave," Mir Murtaza Bhutto, 24, said.

Yahya Bakhtiar, Bhutto's chief lawyer, filed a 103-page petition requesting a stay of execution and asking the Supreme Court to review its 4-3 decision of Feb. 6 upholding Bhutto's murder conspiracy conviction and death sentence.

The court agreed to consider Bakhtiar's petition today.

Bakhtiar said Monday he doubted the Supreme Court judges will change their decision but that he was playing for time hoping that international pressure would persuade Gen. Mohammed Zia Ul-haq, Pakistani military president, to grant Bhutto clemency.

"In a case of this magnitude, we expect a stay," Bakhtiar told reporters yesterday. If the court agrees to hear his request for a review, "If I'm given a fair hearing, it should take two or three months."

Few lawyers think Bakhtiar would be allowed that much time. The fate of Bhutto has tied up the government since his conviction last March on charges of conspiring to murder a political opponent.

If the court refuses to postpone Bhutto's execution, he could be hanged tomorrow, but most lawyers said it would be several days before the execution is carried out.

Bhutto has refused to appeal for clemency and has ordered his family not to do so. But world leaders ranging from President Carter to Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev and Pope John Paul II to Chinese Communist Party Chairman Hua Kuo-feng have asked Zia to spare the former prime minister's life.

Former Pakistani president Fazal Ellahi Chaudhry warned Zia that the execution of Bhutto could bring violence and chaos to Pakistan.

"The execution of Mr. Zulfikar Ali Bhutto can provide much more than a detonation," Chaudhry said in a letter to Zia released by Bhutto's lawyers. "The resultant chaos will certainly fulfill the wishes of national enemies."

Israel wants reduction in U.S. arms aid

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) — Israel yesterday presented U.S. Defense Secretary Harold Brown with plans for a peacetime armed force requiring about 25 percent less in expenditures for U.S. weapons through 1986 than the \$10 billion originally planned.

Defense Minister Ezer Weizman put aside the "Matmon C" weapons purchasing plan worth more than \$10 billion and brought up a new program described as being in its "advanced planning stages," official sources said. It has not been approved by the Israeli government, however.

Weizman earlier publicly voiced Israel's confidence and willingness to cooperate with the United States in guarding Western interests in the Middle East in welcoming Brown at Ben-Gurion airport.

"Israel is ready to contribute to a partnership with the United States for the stability and prosperity for all peace-seeking forces in the region," Weizman said.

Israeli officials have been warning that Saudi Arabia could be next in line for a revolution after Iran.

"We have common strategic interests in the stability and well being of the Middle East," Brown responded.

As part of Israel's planning for peace, Brown was scheduled today to visit the occupied West Bank and the Golan Heights of Syria for "a first hand appreciation of the West Bank as it relates to the Camp David (peace) accords," said Pentagon spokesman Thomas Ross.



U.S. Defense Secretary Harold Brown yesterday met with his Israeli counterpart Ezer Weizman in Tel Aviv to discuss Israel's plans for a peacetime armed force

requiring several billion dollars less in expenditures for American weapons through 1986.

Ross said Brown will land at several places on the West Bank approved beforehand by the secretary. He said the visit was being made at Brown's request. Weizman

will not accompany him. Instead, Brown will be escorted by Maj. Gen. Nathan Sharoni, the head of the army's strategic planning branch. Press coverage of the trip was banned by mutual agreement between Brown and Weizman, Ross said. The United States initially rejected an Israeli request to allow Brown to land in the West Bank in order to dramatize Israel's security problems on its eastern front.

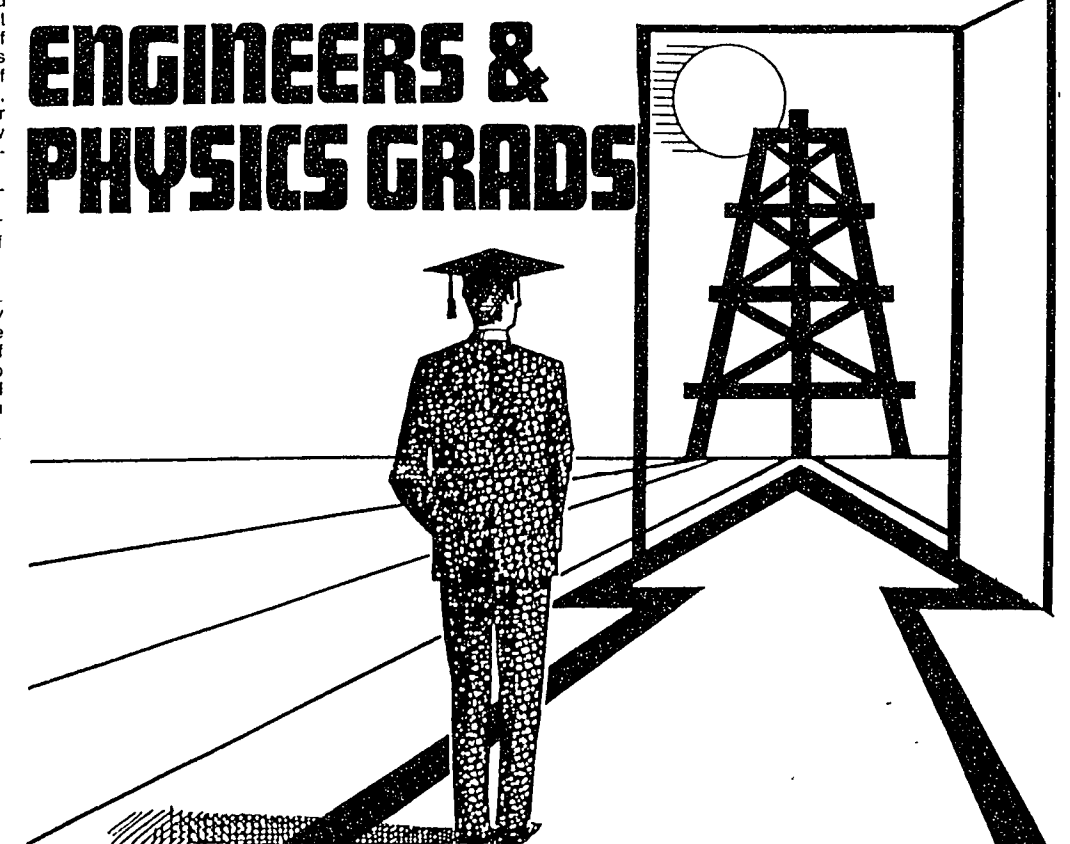
