Mikita leads Hawks over Flyers

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Stan Mikita scored two goals and assisted on a third as the Chicago Black Hawks scored a 5-1 National Hockey League victory over the Philadelphia Flyers last night.

The three points gave him the 38-year-old Mikita 52 for the season and a 21-year career total of 538 goals and 919 assists for 1,457 points, third highest in NHL history behind Gordy Howe and the New York Rangers' Bill Esposito.

Mikita's first goal came at 13:25 of the

opening period. With a delayed penalty call on Philadelphia's Paul Holmgren, Mikita replaced Chicago goaltender Mike Veisor as an extra forward.

The Black Hawks controlled the puck for nearly 20 seconds until Ivan Boldirev broke out of his own zone. He carried the length of the left side of the rink, behind the Flyers net and passed in front to a closing Mikita for the only score of the period.

The Black Hawks broke the game open

with three second-period goals, with the game-winner by Reg Kerr at 2:07. Mikita set up a John Marks goal at 7:51, then scored his second goal and 18th of the season at 11:16.

Moving in on the Flyers net from the left corner, Mikita used Marks to decoy Flyer goalie Wayne Stephenson out of the net, then slipped the puck into the lower right corner of the net.

The teams exchanged goals in the third period.

Alcorn still undefeated after NIT win

 Larry Smith hit a short jumper at the buzzer last night to give unbeaten upstart Alcorn State an 80-78 college basketball victory over Mississippi State in a first-round game of the National Invitation Tournament at Starkville, Miss.

Smith's eight-footer highlighted a frenzied finale, capping a Braves' comeback from a 16-point Mississippi State lead in the first half and an 11-point deficit in the second half.

Alcorn State extended its record to 28-0 with the victory over the Southeastern Conference Bulldogs.

In Birmingham, record-setting Reginald King scored 29 points to lead Alabama to a 98-89 college basketball victory over St. Bonaventure. The Tide scored eight straight points at the start of the second half, seven by King, to take a 16-point lead.

In other NIT action, sharp-shooting junior forward Mike Woodson poured in 30 points as the Indiana Hoosiers handed Texas Tech its worst home defeat in 48 years, routing the Red Raiders 78-59 at Lubbock.

The Big Ten Hoosiers dominated the game from the opening tips against the Southwest Conference's Raiders, running up a 15-2 score before Tech could make its first field goal.

Dayton scored its highest total in its 38 NIT games behind Jim Paxson's 29 points last night, crushing Holy Cross 105-81 at

Dayton.
 Paxson, a 6-foot-6 senior guard, sank all nine of his free throws in leading the Flyers to a 21-for-24 night at the foul line. The Flyers' total wiped out their previous NIT scoring record of 98 points, posted against Chicago Loyola in the 1962 semifinals.

Texas A&M used the inside muscle of Rynn Wright and Vernon Smith to power its way past New Mexico 79-68 at Albuquerque.

Wright and Smith, a pair of rugged sophomore forwards, both scored 23 points to lead the Aggies to their 23rd victory in 31 outings.

With Wright and Smith dominating the inside, Texas A&M led for most of the contest, including a 38-34 halftime advantage.

At Purdue, freshman Mike Searce came off the bench to score a career-high 26 points sparking the Boilermakers to a 97-80 victory over Central Michigan.

Senior reserve Neil Bemenderfer scored 17 points for the Purdue while junior center Joe Barry Carroll scored 15, spending much of the time on the bench as Coach Lee Rose elected to play his reserves.

Purdue took command with a 12-point streak midway in the first half when the Chippewas went scoreless for six minutes.

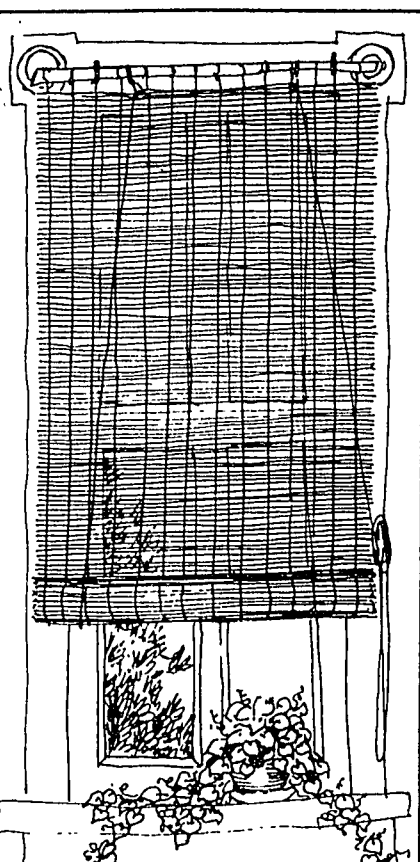

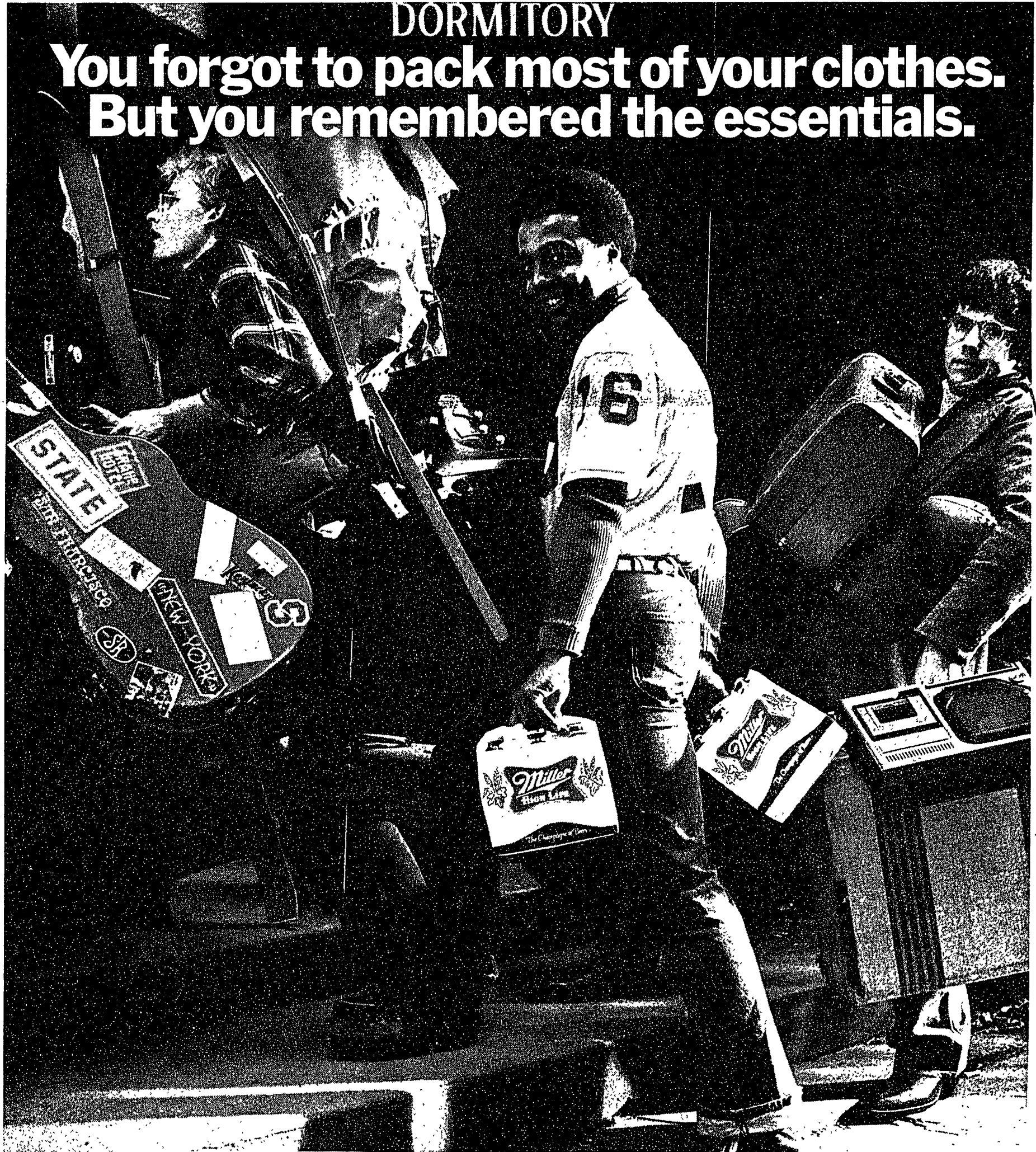
