

## Exec Council offers spot to branch campus member

The Undergraduate Student Government Executive Council last night agreed to have a member of the Council of Branch Campus Student Government Associations on Executive Council.

COBSGA will meet during the summer and decide whether they want to be on Executive Council, USG President Hal Shaffer said.

Having COBSGA on Executive Council will not take any of the organization's autonomy from them, he said.

Executive Council can represent all undergraduate students and "our credibility will be enhanced" by adding COBSGA, Shaffer said.

Mike Scanlon, Organization for Town Independent Students president, said "they'll get the representation they

deserve."

Concerning Spring Week, Interfraternity Council President George "Bucco" Stewart said "as of now" no carnival is planned for next year.

The event will continue to be week-long, but IFC will play a smaller part, he said.

The carnival has lost money the last two years and "we can't afford it again," he said.

"The weather totally controls how much we lose," Stewart said.

In other business, Council also appointed Steve Matt, former Association of Residence Hall Students vice president, as chairman of the USG Encampment to be held during Fall Term.

## Tuition differential requested

Tuition differentials have not been included in the appropriation acts for Temple and Penn State since the 1968-69 fiscal year, he said.

"By not requiring a minimum tuition differential, the state legislature may undermine the purpose of our state-supported system which is to provide quality education to Pennsylvania students at a lower cost," Benedict said.

"We're not dictating what should be done. Rather, we're recommending that the General Assembly take a good look

at the survey," Landis said. "However, before any action is taken there should be a total economic analysis since this is a very complex issue."

Landis said the study was performed independently of the Department of Education.

In the study, it was noted that "the manner in which an acceptable ratio could be attained is not limited solely to raising tuition for non-residents. Rather, it may be deemed appropriate to lower the tuition rates charged Pennsylvania residents."

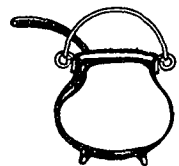
