





### Rehabilitation to research; sports center does it all

Daily Collegian Sports Writer Editor's note: This is the second in a three-part series on sportsmedicine. Today's segment is on the sportsmedicine program at Penn State.

Everybody knows that Penn State has one of the top athletic programs in the country, but very few know about the excellence of the sportsmedicine The Nittany Lion athletic teams enjoy the luxury of having some of the best

sportsmedicine facilities in the country.

The University operates four fully staffed training rooms and recently opened the Penn State Sports Medicine Center at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Before an athlete can participate on a varsity team at Penn State, he or she is subjected to a very thorough preseason


testing and screening program. W. James Hochberg, the coordinator of the sportsmedicine program at Penn State, said every athlete is thoroughly evaluated before stepping onto the playing field. "Before the season starts," Hochberg aid, "each athlete fills out a prepar-

ticipation medical form, which is screened by the coaches to see if any of follow-up care." the players have problems now. Then we do a physical examination.' The examination includes strength, range of motion and flexibility tests. In addition, football players and other
