

Abood shooting for improvement

Everybody can count on the birds making their annual trek north for the spring, just as women's golf coach Annette Thompson can depend on Lady Lion golfer Jane Abood competing at golf tournaments without failure.

Abood, a freshman, has qualified for every tournament this spring with the Lady Lions and has posted some impressive rounds. Just last week at the Marshall Invitational in LaSage, W. Va., Abood paced Penn State to a third-place finish when she shot an 80 and an 82 in the 36-hole tournament.

But Abood said some aspects of her golf game are still unclipped and sometimes she does not play up to her potential, or at least she feels that way.

"I don't think that I have played up to my potential," Abood said. "I'm hitting the ball but I wasn't thinking or playing aggressively."

Abood said she is thinking much more on the golf course and said that her entire attitude about her game is very different.

"I would tend to get double bogeys," she said. "I would kind of fall asleep on a hole, but now I concentrate on the hole, 18 holes. And my putting is better because of it."

Abood is one of six freshmen to crack into the golf lineup. She is from Bethesda, Md., and won the Maryland state junior title in 1978. She said that it was when she was playing at her best. But

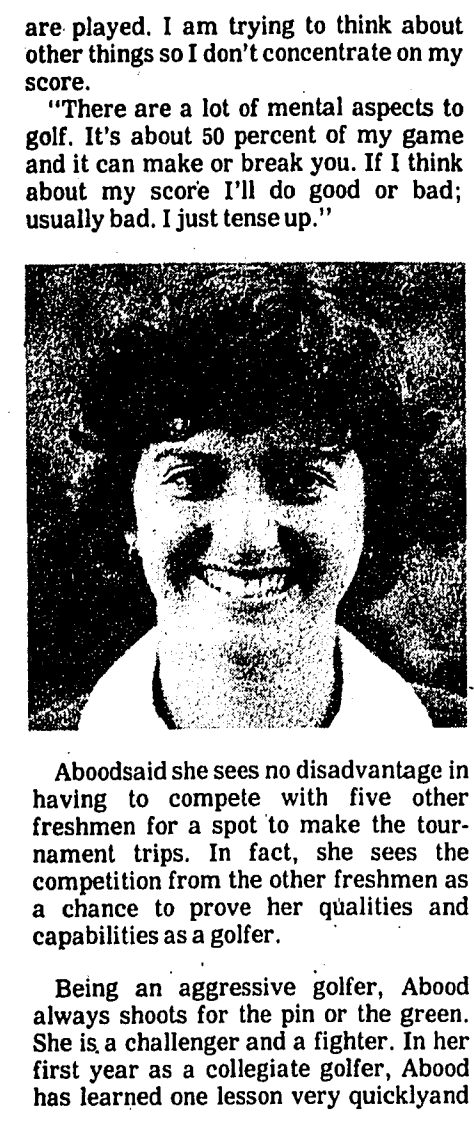
now, she feels that her golf game is just not as good as it could be.

"I am not yet pleased with my golfing," Abood said. "I need to learn certain shots, like how to take the ball or hook the ball to get out of trouble. I want to learn some touch shots like putting some back-spin on the ball."

Abood is averaging 84 strokes a round this spring and only trails Lady Lion golfer Lynn Martini by one stroke in that category. Abood has been awesome, impressive and an asset to the golf team. But above all she has been consistent. However, she is shooting to get her average in the 70s.

"I have to spend a lot more time on my driving and iron play," she said. "I have to be more aggressive with my shot and my mental aspect has to be better. I'm counting up my score in a tournament before five holes



are played. I am trying to think about my score."

"There are a lot of mental aspects to golf. It's about 50 percent of my game and it can make or break you. I think about my score I'll do good or bad; usually bad. I just tense up."

Abood said she enjoys golf because it is a competitive sport. Also, a golfer doesn't have to depend on the coach to be put into an event like a basketball player does, she said.

"It all depends on how well I play," Abood said.

Abood becomes very disturbed if someone says that golfers are not athletes, she feels that golfers are athletes just as football players are considered athletes.

"Golf is the only sport where you hit a ball that is not moving," Abood said. "You have to have rhythm and timing. When you play 18 holes you have to be in condition because you feel like you just ran a mile. Just because you don't hit anything with your body doesn't mean that golfers are not athletes. You have to be reasonably strong to play golf."

With one major spring tournament left to play (the Southern Invitational), and three more years to compete at the collegiate level, Abood appears to have the makings of a high quality contender in the golf world. But she feels that she has to achieve one thing.

"I know more now than I ever did," Abood said. "I now have to put it to use."

Softball team needs sweep for playoff bid

Since its start almost a decade ago, Gentle Thursday has gradually grown as a day of sharing, making new friends and partying for everyone all over the campus.

But this year, at least one group won't be able to take part in any of the festivities. The softball team (9-6) travels to Temple (6-4) this afternoon for a double-header that may determine who will earn one of the four spots in Eastern regional competition. Temple finished second behind Eastern champion Rutgers in the regionals last year.

It back against the wall, Penn State must win both games of the double-header against the Owls to be considered for an invitation. The Lady Lions' chances are very slim.

"I don't really know what our chances are of getting an invitation to regionals," Penn State coach Pat McCartney said. "If we lose these games, I can say that we'll probably not get an invitation. From the records of the other schools, it doesn't mean that if we win we will get an invitation either."

Temple was scheduled to open the season against the Lady Lions, but the game was canceled. Co-captains Kris Zawacki and Jan Carlson said they think Temple was probably not ready to play the Lady Lions.

"Our team was ready and really wanted to play Temple the first time," Zawacki said. "The field was in good condition and I don't think that they were ready to play us. I know that one of their pitchers was sidelined."

Carlson said earlier in the season that the Temple coach knew Penn State could easily have defeated Temple in the season opener and was reluctant to reschedule the game but finally agreed to play because of the invitations.

"I feel they are going to be tough," McCartney said. "It should be a good contest. They have some good pitchers and have players that play in summer leagues with people from our team."

"We are going to have to expect very good ball games with Temple. I expect to see close and low scoring games with them."

McCartney does not plan on changing the lineup for the games. Regular pitchers Rayne Yori (3-2) and Brenda Frey (4-3) are slated to start today.

Erving leads Sixers over Boston

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Julius Erving scored 28 points as the Philadelphia 76ers held off a frantic final-period Boston rally to beat the Celtics 99-97 last night and take a 2-1 lead in their National Basketball Association semifinal playoff series.

The 76ers, trailing 69-60, outscored the Celtics 19-8 in a third-period eruption that gave them a 78-66 lead at the end of three quarters. Erving scored 12 and Caldwell Jones four during the Philadelphia rally.

The 76ers increased their lead to 88-74 midway through the fourth quarter, where the Celtics suddenly caught fire and with 39 seconds to play moved within two of 89-87 on Larry Bird's third three-point field goal of the game.

Boston got the ball back, but in a scramble under the basket, the 76ers stole it and dribbled away the final 10 seconds.

Erving got offensive help from veteran Lionel Hollins, who scored 16, and Maurice Cheeks and Darrell Dawkins, each with 14 points.

Bird, the fabulous rookie from Indiana State who triggered the Celtics to the best record in the NBA this season, contributed 28 points, but his archrival contributed 19 and Cedric Maxwell 17.

The Celtics led 28-26 at the end of the first period in which Maxwell scored his first points, personally outscoring the Sixers at one point, 10-2.

Boston led 47-45 at halftime with the help of 10 points and 11 rebounds by Bird. It was a three-point field goal by Bird that tied the score at 47-45.
