# Deficit in oil reserves improves

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The decade-long decline in U.S. development of known fields crude oil reserves slowed to just 800 million barrels last year, the smallest dip in recent years, the American Petroleum Institute announced yesterday. The big oil trade group, in its last reserve survey, estimated

the nation's proven reserves — those recoverable from known fields under existing economic and operating conditions — at 27.1 billion barrels on Dec. 31, 1979. "This reserves report highlights a position we have advocated for some time — that given the opportunity, the oil
