A 'sticky' tradition dies

The Penn State Diner, that 50-year-old Rock of Gibraltar landmark at 126 W. College Ave., closed its doors for the final time Friday at 6 p.m. William D. Henning, the owner and manager of the diner, filed for bankruptcy at the Federal Bankruptcy Court in Harrisburg on Monday. The diner, which opened in 1930, was one of the few places in State College

open 24 hours a day. "The block is at a loss without the diner open," said Chris Papas, co-owner of the Corner Restaurant, 100 W. College Ave. "There has been a noted increase in morning coffee drinkers and breakfast people" because of the closing, Papas said. The Corner Restaurant has also increased its lunch hours to serve more customers, Papas said. Many of the diner's now out-of-work employees have approached the Corner Restaurant for jobs, Papas said. He will try to hire some of them for the fall, he said.

An employee of The Candy Cane, 128 W. College Ave., said the closing could possibly hurt their business because they advertised along with the diner. —By Barry Rosenberg

Fire causes evacuation of apartments

A fire caused moderate damage Saturday night to a 20-unit apartment house at 126 E. Nittany Ave. and forced the evacuation of all its residents, an Alpha Fire Company spokesman said. Public Information Officer David Hamilton, said the cause of the fire is under investigation. The fire started in the basement and created heavy smoke which went through the entire building, Hamilton said. Fire damage was limited to the downstairs storage area. All residents will be able to return to their apartments, he said. Alpha Fire Company was one of the companies at the fire. Hamilton said they stayed there for two and one-half hours, using 56 men and seven pieces of equipment. Older people as well as students live in the building, Hamilton said. "The fire threat was pretty critical compared to most structure fires, he said."



This fire, occurring Saturday night in an apartment house at 126 E. Nittany Ave., forced the residents to evacuate the 20-unit structure. Alpha Fire Company fought the blaze for two and one-half hours, limiting the fire damage to the downstairs storage area. There were no reports of injuries and all residents were able to return to their apartments.

However, there were no reports of residents or fire fighters sustaining injuries. Smoke detectors in the building alerted some of the residents, Hamilton said. Two bicycles were stolen over last weekend in separate incidents, State College police reported. Thieves stole a blue Schwinn Varsity 10-speed bicycle from 140 N. Patterson St. Friday night, police said. The bicycle, owned by Nicholas Merolli, is valued at \$200. Someone stole a girl's blue three-speed bicycle from 112 S. Pugh St. Sunday night, police said. The bicycle was owned by Maria Spadaro, of that address.
