

Bucs face Expos hampered by injuries

PITTSBURGH (AP)—When it comes to limps, aches and grimmaces, the Pittsburgh Pirates are just like the rest of the contenders at this stage of the baseball season. But there is something else, beyond the muscle pains and knee strains, which the 1979 World Series champions hope will set them apart.

"We're known for rising to the occasion. When we have to win, we do," outfielder Mike Easler said in advance of a weekend series with Montreal, who is tied with Pittsburgh atop the National League East.

Easler is hitting .356 and Lee Lacy is batting .346 platooning in leftfield this season, and they have risen to the occasion to offset assorted injuries to big-name Pirates.

"This is going to be a great series with Montreal," bubbled Easler. "The stage is set, two first-place teams going at each other. You know everybody will be up."

A season ago, the Pirates were 24-9 in August and 20-10 in September. So far this August, they are 8-6, but they have won eight of their last 10 games, including a recent four-game sweep of second-place Philadelphia.

Rightfielder Dave Parker, first baseman Willie Stargell and shortstop Tim Lincecum were all sidelined during a Wednesday night loss to the New York Mets.

Parker's injury is the most serious. He has missed four straight starts with an ailing knee. Stargell, sidelined earlier in the season with a hamstring pull, has a lesser knee strain. And Lincecum has a sore back.
