Centre County voters increase by 16 percent

Centre County has about 54,569 registered voters eligible to vote in Tuesday's general election — an increase of 16 percent or 8,850 voters since last year. Of the 54,569 registered voters, about 25,968 or 47 percent are registered Republicans; 22,087 or 40 percent are registered Democrats and 6,496 or 11 percent are registered as independent voters.
