Professor earns legal privilege

Entitled to argue legal cases before the Supreme Court

Daily Collegian Staff Writer Barry Myers, associate professor in the College of Business Administration, recently became a member of the select group of attorneys permitted to argue cases

before the U.S. Supreme Court. "It's a real experience to argue a case there," Myers said. "The Supreme Court is different in that it's an academic exercise."

To be entitled to argue cases before the Supreme Court, an attorney must be in practice for four or more years. Then he must take an exam and file an application for admittance to the highest court in the state they practice in.

Once admitted to the highest court in the state, he needs recommendations from two attorneys already practicing before the Supreme Court. Lastly, the attorney must be in good standing and have all of his creden-

tials in order, Myers said. The fact that many attorneys do not know how to apply for admission to the Supreme Court is a major reason why the group is so small, Myers said. Also, many attorneys many attorneys do not apply for practical reasons, because they are unlikely to.



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
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
