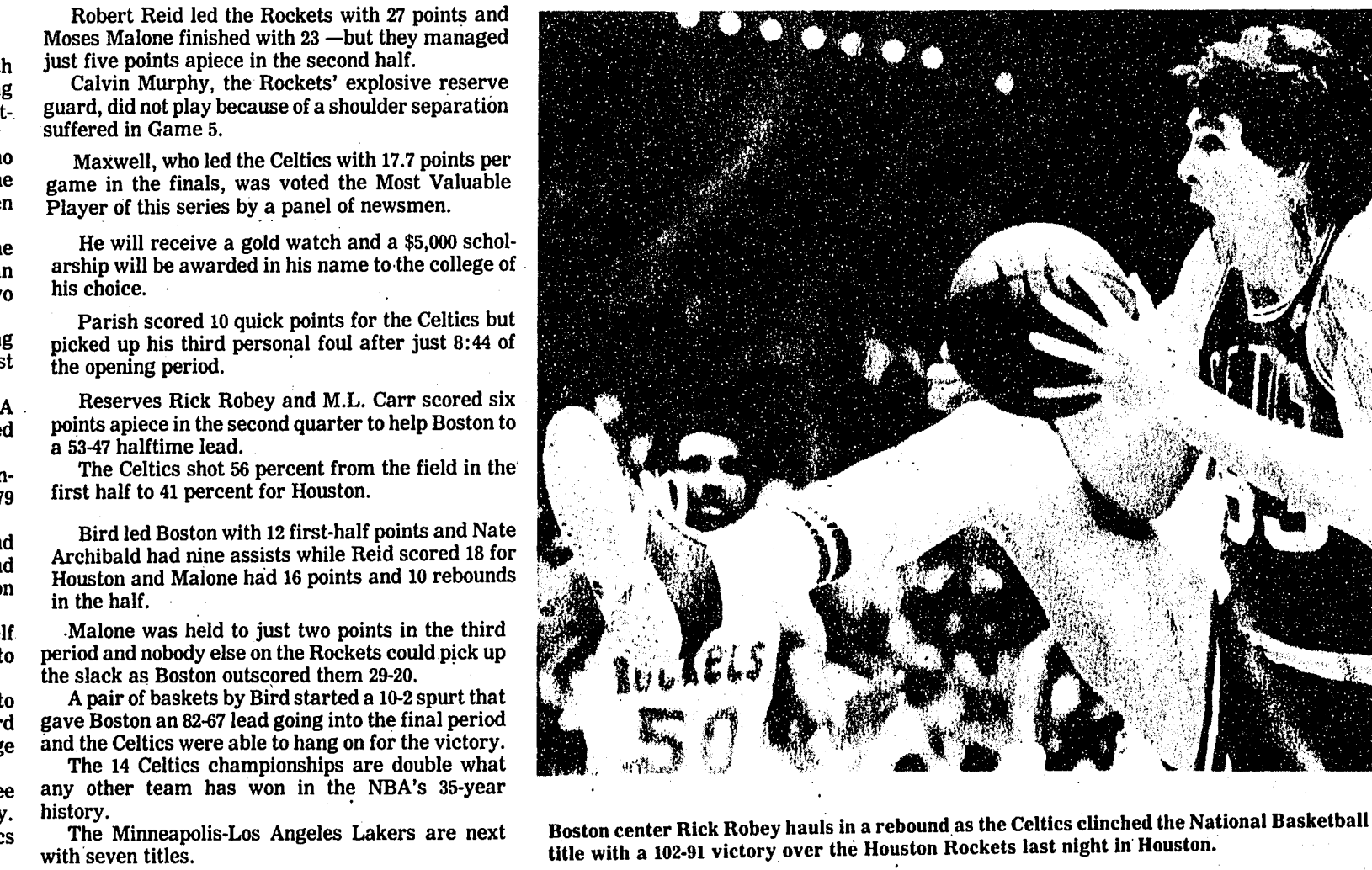

Mike Schmidt opened the eighth with a single and went to second on Manny Trillo's one-out single. With two out, Bowa lofted a fly ball to right-center. North ran to his left and reached up to make the catch, only to have the ball carom off his glove.
