**Referral services available for part-time work**

Representatives from the State College Job Service office will be providing job information and referral services to University students from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. tomorrow in 324 HUB. The job information and referral services will be available for students seeking immediate part-time and temporary work in the State College area. Through this service, students seeking employment can be matched to available job openings. Frank Clemson, manager of the State College Job Service office, said, "The more flexible the applicant, the better the chance he or she will have of obtaining a job. The office handles a full range of job opportunities, Clemson said. The greatest number of availabilities are in retail sales and food service but the office also has a number of openings in domestic work and construction. In addition to part-time job opportunities, information on careers such as State Civil Service jobs, and resume preparation information will be available. Representatives will also be at the HUB Sept. 17, 24 and 30. —by Karen Fishman

**Drought had little effect on crops, prices**

Consumer produce lovers need not worry that last year's drought will affect this year's crops — or push food prices through the roof of the site. Pennsylvania and most of the country had ideal weather for crop production this summer, Lou Moore, University agricultural marketing specialist, said. Pennsylvania produced its largest corn crop ever, he said. One hundred and four bushels an acre were yielded, compared to 91 bushels an acre last year. This increased the yield from last year's total of 1,280 acres to 1,330 acres. Prices increased only 8 to 10 percent in 1980 and 40 percent of that was marketing costs, Neigh said. According to the July issue of "Agricultural Outlook," a U.S. government publication, the farm price for corn was \$3.15 per bushel for 1980-81 and for 1981-82 it will be \$2.85 to \$3.45. —by Laurene Black

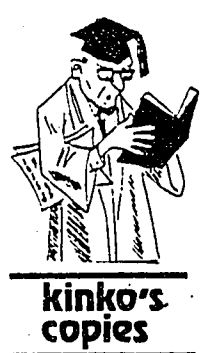

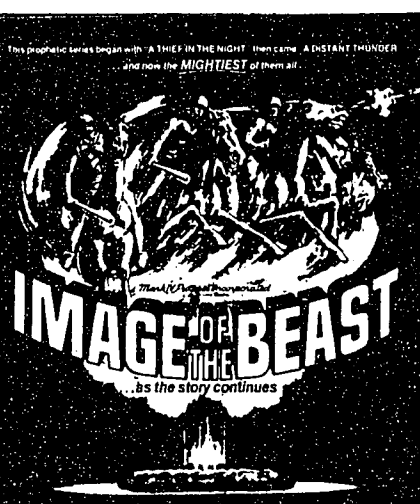
